BY THE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

—Among the few Republicans left in the State House is Mr. Roberts, Private Secretary to Governor Breyfogle, and it is fitting that he should be foremost among those who have survived the last Democratic earthquake. Mr. Roberts is one of the best, most men in Indiana upon party matters and upon the men who constitute the Republican party. He is genial, approachable, and in every way a model man in the position he holds, and he has been mentioned frequently by the friends he has made as a possible candidate for a position befitting his ability. The Progress will be gratified at the promotion of Mr. Roberts, a promotion which is certain to come within the next two years.

—Koch's solution of bacilli in glycerine has a rival in the preparation of two Havana physicians as a preventative of yellow fever. It is nothing more or less than an injection with marsh mosquitoes. The mosquitoes must first have stung a yellow fever patient and become impregnated with the poison. They are then caught and powdered and manufactured into lymph.

—The Committee of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian church of the United States on the Revision of the Confession of Faith, after a very harmonious session at Washington City, lasting eleven days, has completed its work. The changes made have generally met with unanimous approval. Its work will be reported to the Assembly in Detroit next May, and by it referred to the Presbyterians for their approval or rejection. The changes made in the statements of the confession have been of great importance, but have in no way impaired the integrity of the system of doctrine so long held by the church.

—The Scientific American has information that commercial travellers are offering imitation coffee berries which can be sold so low to dealers as to yield a profit of 100 per cent. These berries are made artificially from vegetable glands and the flour of some cereal. This mixture is placed in a mould and dried. The pit in the false berry is neither so long or deep as in the real berry. The color is well imitated, but the false berry is much harder and can not be broken with the teeth. The berries are mixed with a small proportion of the true berries before selling.

—Indianapolis is to have a foundling home modeled on the London plan. A large bay window, opening easily, comes down in convenient reach of the ground. Just inside is a cradle. The person wishing to dispose of a child raises the window, drops the baby in the cradle, rings an electric bell and goes away unobserved and, even if seen, unnoticed. This plan saves much time and many ingested lives.

—An interesting suit promises to come up for settlement at this term of court. Several years ago the Christian people of the Duckworth neighborhood, four miles west of this city, organized a Union church and built church property at a cost of \$2,500. Since that time the Baptists and Christian denominations have alternately used the property in perfect harmony. But a few years ago a "Southern Methodist" denomination was organized and as it embraced some members of the old denominations, it claimed an equal right to the use of the property and insisted on exercising it. The two older denominations objected. The feeling wrought up by the difference grew strong and at last the Southern Methodists, not being allowed the use of the property, tore up the carpets and, with the furniture, took them from the church. The suit is brought by the Baptists and Christians to quiet the title to the property and to compel defendants to restore to the church the furniture and carpets. —Martinsville Republicans.

After Dr. Breyfogle Again.

One day last week, at Chicago, William S. Alley filed a petition in circuit court asking that a receiver be appointed for the New Monson. Alley, who is a New York stock broker, charges that President Breyfogle has doctored up the records of the directory and packed the board with his personal friends. He is charged with having wrecked the road and rendered it bankrupt. The court is asked to restrain further disposition of the stock and to prevent an election of officers. A conspiracy is alleged between Mr. Breyfogle and Henry S. Ives, of New York, to wreck the company and buy it in for confederates, and that Mr. Breyfogle is scheming to increase the capital stock to \$75,000. Director John B. Hughes, speaking for President Breyfogle, pronounced the proceedings simply a malicious attack on the credit of the company, organized by the former solicitor, Harry Crawford, and backed by Carson and others of the old management, who were outgeneraled in March, and who now seek to get even, and defeat an election of officers in March unless they can dictate who the men shall be. This struggle of financial giants will be worth watching.

Speaking of President Breyfogle, the Louisville TRUTH of recent date says:

"At a recent banquet of various railroad agents, President Ingalls of the Big Four, went out of his way to pay a tribute to President Breyfogle, of the L. N. A. & C. He said that Dr. Breyfogle's skillful and successful management of that road up to date unmistakably stamped him as one of the intelligent railroad men of the country, and he otherwise complimented the Doctor in handsome phrases upon his success. This may not be altogether palatable to President Breyfogle in Louisville, but on the basis it is well deserved, gratifying to his friends and Truth, feeling that the Doctor has regularly and unfairly gotten the hot end of it from the dailies, is glad to call attention to his success. The net earnings of the Monson for January 1891, were \$25,000 in excess of the preceding January. This does not look very much as if Lawyer Crawford will be able to put the road into the hands of a receiver."

The bullet which broke his leg made Lamb a sickly looking piece of mutton, and he shows every evidence of having passed through several sleepless nights since he was captured. His wounds were of such a nature that it was considered best to have him under treatment at his sister's, Mrs. Chesley Chambers. Lamb recovered sufficiently to be removed to this city Friday, and he is now in jail with his brother-in-law, Chesley Chambers.

At Indianapolis some of the large department stores are carrying dismay to a number of stores, the specialties of which they have added to their stock. The last act of dealers to be attacked are the druggists, and for several days they have been holding secret meetings, perfecting strategic plans that they are hopeful will result in the signal defeat of the common enemy. This coalition of retail druggists was brought about by one of the stores added to its specialties a stock of patent medicines, which it proposes to retail at cut rates.

### ECHOES FROM THE INDIANA LAW FOUNDRY.

—Ind. News: In the House, Tuesday afternoon, Mr. Peters made another effort to compel the committee on temperance (Mr. Gent, chairman) to report back the various bills that had been referred to them, but it was not successful. There has not been a meeting of the committee yet, and probably never will be. Mr. Gent is a bright and shining light as chairman of this committee.

—The special committee of lawyers in the House, to whom was referred the fee and salary bill to report on the constitutional questions involved, after having been at work three days, considered the matter at length, arrived at the conclusion that the fee and salary bill as adopted in committee of the whole in the House, was of doubtful constitutionality, so much as by it the county officers are classified and paid salaries according to this compilation, and not in accordance with populations of counties or services rendered. The committee therefore reported a bill specifying every officer of every county, and the salary he shall receive, and it is also proposed to fix the number and pay of all deputies, and not have their number and pay fixed by the county commissioners. This is practically undoing what has already been done, and the whole matter had to be gone over again in the House, taking the greater part of last week.

—Ind. Sun: If the legislature wants to economize so badly they can taste it, why don't they quit paying the members and employees for Sunday work, when the foundry isn't going? They howl hour after hour about the people being robbed, want to cut down the salaries of public officers and lower the taxes but you never hear a whisper about cutting off their own pay for something they don't do. They ride home on Saturday night on railway passes, and spit on the stove over Sunday, and then come back Monday to shriek out economy, draw pay for the Sabbath and charge mileage for the trip. In these two items alone the State spends enough to pay a quarter of the expense of the session. The present legislature is one big, ice cold bluf.

—Ind. News: It is settled that Mr. Gent will remain chairman of the house committee on temperance and it is just as firmly settled that this committee will not even be called together and, of course, will make no report. In the House yesterday Mr. Peters called up his resolutions, demanding that Mr. Gent either make reports on bills referred to his committee or resign his position. The resolution was sent to the table with rush. Mr. Gent defended himself by saying that the Democratic platform did not call for any temperance legislation and there was no demand for it among Democrats.

—The provision regarding the taking effect of the fee and salary bill as follows:

Where any clerk, auditor, recorder, treasurer or sheriff has been elected by the people of his county before the taking effect of this act to any office, the term of which does not expire until after the taking effect of this act, such officer during the time that he holds such a term shall not be subject to the provisions of this act. He shall hold such term of office, and perform the duties thereof and receive the compensation therefor, prescriptive by law, the same as if this act had not passed.

—A bill has been introduced into the legislature fixing salaries of county commissioners. Under the provisions of this bill, which is likely to become a law, the commissioners of Monroe county will each be paid \$225 per year.
