In a talk with the COURIER, the Hon. Geo. W. Cooper said that he could not tell whether or not there would be an extra session of Congress. The members of the lower house of Congress are generally in favor of it, while a majority of the members of the Senate are opposed to it. It is not likely that the President will call an extra session in March as he will be too busy for some time to come after that date getting his administration in running shape. If an extra session is called it will most likely be for September.

The following resolutions were adopted by the Monroe county Farmers' Institute:

- Resolved that we view the road problem as the paramount question and we ask the Legislature to enact such laws as will enable us to improve our highways.
- Resolved that we regard farm reading circles as a necessity to our highest development socially and intellectually.

- Resolved that while we desire our state to be represented at the world's Columbian exposition in comparison with her great interests to the end that the world may understand our vast resources, yet we must express our disapproval of the fact the farmers of our state have been almost entirely ignored in the apportionment of managers from this state.
- Resolved that we ask the Legislature to enact a law to more effectively protect the farmers against fraud and imposition in the sale of commercial fertilizers.
- Resolved that we tender our sympathy to our president, A. E. Johnson, who was called from us by reason of the death of a near relative.

In addition to the above there is charged to each person owning, keeping or harboring within the county, one male dog, \$1.00; one female dog, \$2.00; each additional dog, \$2.00. Also an additional Tax for the City of Bloomington of same amount.

The first installment of Taxes (which is one half the taxes assessed with road tax added) must be paid on or before the

**THIRD MONDAY IN APRIL, 1893.**

Or the whole amount will be delinquent and subject to penalty. The second installment on or before the

**FIRST MONDAY IN NOVEMBER, 1893.**

Road receipts will not be received except on first half or April installment of Taxes.

County orders will not be paid to anyone owing delinquent Taxes. All parties are warned against buying them.

City Orders will only be taken to the amount of the General Municipal Tax. Special School, Tuition, Road and Sinking Fund must be paid in Cash.  
County Orders will only be taken for County Taxes.

The owner of property on the first day of April in any year shall be liable for the Taxes of that year. The purchaser of property on the first day of April shall be considered as the owner on that day.

Call upon the Auditor for irregularities or for reduction in your taxes. The Treasurer cannot make such reductions.

Assignees, Guardians, Administrators and others who pay taxes on property in trust, and persons whose taxes are complicated, such as undivided estates, etc., are earnestly requested to settle such taxes before the last day of April as it requires considerable time to make the divisions and separate receipts therefor.

Tax-payers should examine their Receipts and change before leaving the Treasurer's office and see that they are correct. Those who have lands or other property in more than one Township must see that they have a receipt for each township. If your receipts do not mention personal property or all your real estate, it is not paid.
