In a talk with the Courier, the Hon. Goo. W. Cooper said that he could not tell whether or not there would be an extra session of Congress. The members of the lower house of Congress are generally in favor of it, while a majority of the members of the Senate are opposed to it. It is not likely that the President will call an extra session in March as he will be too busy for some time to come after that date getting his administration in running shape. If an extra session is called it will most likely be for September.

The following resolutions were adopted by the Monroe county Farmers' Institute:

1. Resolved that we view the road problem as the paramount question and we ask the Legislature to enact such laws as will enable us to improve our highways.

2. Resolved that we regard farm reading circles as necessary to the highest development of intellectually.

3. Resolved that we endorse the act of the Legislature in providing for farm institutes and we earnestly recommend the continuation of the appropriation for that purpose.

4. Resolved that while we desire our state to be represented at the world's Columbian exhibition in Chicago, we have great interest in the end that the world may understand our vast resources, yet we must express our disapproval of its fact the farmers of our state have been almost entirely ignored in the apportionment of managers from this state.

5. Resolved that we the Legislature, to meet, do more effectually protect the farmers against fraud and imposition in the sale of commercial fertilizers.

6. Resolved that we tender our sympathy to our president, A. E. Johnson, who was called from us by reason of the death of a near relative.
