Serious Riot.
Mexico City special: The Political Chief of Marshal of Irupato has rendered a report on the recent attack on a native Protestant church in the city, and stated that the case was not of any gravity, but the Minister of the Interior has given orders for a full examination into the case. No Americans were assaulted, and the United States Consular Agent residing in the city has issued a report of the matter to the American Minister, saying that the affair was exaggerated.

Spain Is Dallying.
Havana special: At a recent joint session of the United States and Spanish Commissions, the Spaniards, according to a report, declared that they were unable to evacuate the island immediately, and the American Commissioners insist that their instructions called for an immediate evacuation. After two hours' conference on the subject, the joint commissions were unable to reach any definite agreement.

Empress Deposed.
The Peking correspondent of the London Times says: The restoration of the regency is complete. The Empress Dowager receives the Cabinet daily, seated beside the Emperor. The Government is more retrograde and reactionary. The immediate exciting cause of the change was the impending edict ordering officials to abolish the cue and to adopt foreign dress.

Hobson at Work.
Sancto special: Hobson has brought to Santiago a number of six-inch and one-inch guns of similar caliber taken from a Spanish gunboat. He will start immediately to work on the coast fortifications. The Teresa is ready to sail for the United States Monday. Hobson says he will save all the big guns from the Spanish ships as soon as a dozen iron boats arrive.

Turkish Troops Must Leave Crete.
The collective note of Great Britain, France, Italy and Russia, demanding the withdrawal of the Turkish troops in the island of Crete, has been presented to the Turkish Government. It insist that the Turkish troops must evacuate the island of Crete within a month, their withdrawal to commence within a fortnight.

Two Students Drowned.
Two students of Culver Military Academy, Plympton, were drowned in Lake Minnetonka. One was G. M. Head, head of Terre Haute, and the other E. Burner of Michigan. They were in a sailboat, and it capsized in deep water.

New Monitors Named.
Secretary of State has named the four new monitors contracted for last year as follows: That at Bath the Connecticut; at Nixon's, the Florida; at Newport News, the Arkansas; and, at San Francisco, the Wyoming.

Yachting Party Drowned.
N. L. Westbury, Commodore of the Troy Yacht Club, and three companions, Stephen J. Mallory, Mrs. William Brodin and Miss Eliza Savage, were drowned by the capsizing of a yacht in the Hudson River at Troy, N. Y.

Gov. Smith Will Recover.
The condition of Gov. A. J. Smith of the Soldiers' Home at Los Angeles, Cal., is better than at any time since he was shot. However, he is still in a feverish condition, and his recovery is uncertain. The condition of his health is favorable.

A Square Mile of Fire.
According to a dispatch from Shanghai office, a fire destroyed over a square mile of the city, including the Government Building and Temple. A thousand lives were lost.

Combine Against America.
The London correspondent of the London Daily Mail says there are rumors of the formation of a combine of the whole German iron trade to meet the severe American competition.

Three Deaths.
A freight wreck in the Burlington yard at Lowell, Mass., resulted in the death of Eng. So. Bruce Freeman E. J. Walters and Brakeman William McCarl.

Cereras To Be a Senator.
It is announced at Madrid that Admiral Cereras will be appointed a life Senator.

Died in Agency.
George Ott, a farmer living near Syracuse, Oneida County, committed suicide by drinking carbolic acid. He was formerly very wealthy, and was forced by despondency over business reverses. He died in the greatest agony.

One Hundred Drowned.
A special dispatch from Bombay says that a ferryboat was capsized while crossing the Indus at Mittan-Kote, the seat of the Peshawar, on the west bank of the river, and 100 of the passengers were drowned.

EASTERN.

Daniel Eshbaugh, of New York, president of the New England Loan and Trust Company, has been missing since the day when he received an appointment to the board of directors.

At a meeting of the Chicago platform Democrats in New York, Henry George, the son of the single tax advocate, was nominated to head an independent Democratic ticket.

Judge Henry T. Sampson, of Centerville, Pa., while engaged in arranging some gear at one of the circular saws while it was in motion, was caught by a saw and lost two fingers.

Kate Phillips, 23 years old, a variety actress, tried to kill herself at New York by taking laudanum. She comes from Illinois, ran away from her husband, and fears he means her injury.

Peter Crick, Peter Corral, John Lomak and Martin Simotowich, miners were burned to death by a gas explosion in the Leigh shops of the Welsh Valley Coal Company.

A special from Dover, N. H., says: N. A. & J. Sawyer, woolen manufacturers have assigned. Liabilities are estimated at \$1,000,000. Ex-Governor Charles H. Sawyer is President of the corporation.

Scott Ingalls, 35 years old, an actor until recently in Miss Julia Arthur's company

shot and killed himself in a New York theatrical boarding house. Ingalls had been dismissed by Miss Arthur's manager.

Robert Courtney, 15 years of age, died at the Boston city hospital as a result of injuries sustained while playing football at Franklin field, that city. Three players fell upon him and caused an injury to his spine, which resulted in total paralysis.

At a meeting of the trustees of the University of Pennsylvania it was announced that Col. Joseph M. Bennett, the late merchant and philanthropist, had bequeathed to the institution the number of valuable properties valued at over \$400,000.

A sad accident, resulting in the drowning of a small child, occurred at the home of Captain and Mrs. N. A. Belvoirton, Pa. The eastern, containing a tank of water, had been left uncovered by an inmate of the house, and Anna Land, 3 years old, toddled to the reservoir and fell in.

WESTERN.

At Atlanta, Ga., Mrs. Edith Davours was killed by electricity. She touched a wire which was being pulled from a light pole over a vacant lot.

Lawson College at Lawson, Mo., was destroyed by fire. The building was erected by the Presbyterians. Church services were held at a cost of \$16,000.

The threatened labor trouble in Butte, Mont., have been averted. The strikers have given in to the Anaconda Company and have received from their demands.

Superintendent W. J. Parks of the Union elevated at Toledo, Ohio, died at the hospital after suffering for three weeks from a heart ailment. He was the third victim of the Union elevator fire.
