A LITTLE QUEEN.

There are now in Europe three child heirs to thrones. One is the little king of Spain, Alfonso XIII, 4 years old, whose wise and popular mother, Queen Christina, is regent during his minority. King Alexander of Serbia is now 14 years of age, and his kingdom is in the hands of a council of three regents till he is permitted to hold the reins himself. Then comes the little girl queen of Holland, 10 years old, whose mother, Queen Emma, a lady already endeared to the Dutch on account of her high spirit and shrewdness as well as her kindness, will rule for the young Wilhelmina during her childhood.

Every child has been put forth by Queen Emma to make her daughter strong and fearless. She is to have the broadest, best, thorough education that can be given Europe. She will be expected to know all matters of statecraft and the history and ruling of nations thoroughly. Queen Emma herself is a woman of remarkable character. If she had the rule of a realm as large as that of Queen Victoria, she would be far less pliant in the hands of her ministers than Victoria is, probably. The world would hear of her in connection with other things than the mere increasing of her family and setting parliamentary grants for them.

Little Princess Wilhelmina will have a great and wise education doubtless. The Dutch say her mother desires to make a king of her rather than a queen. She will be put through all the exercises necessary to show her how to make the graceful figurehead for a fat little kingdom. But one pleasure she can never know—that of falling in love and choosing her own sweetheart as the very poorest American girl may do. For Princess Wilhelmina is already betrothed. The arrangement was doubtless made by her far-seeing mother. The fair-haired child is betrothed to Prince William, eldest son of Duke Adolphus of Nassau. The late King William, Wilhelmina's father, was king of Holland and duke of Luxembourg. But in the duchy of Luxembourg the Salic law prevails, and consequently no woman can rule it. When William died, therefore, although his daughter became queen of Holland, she could not hold the duchy of Luxembourg, which accordingly passed out of the family and to the next heir, Prince Adolphus of Nassau. By the marriage of his son to Princess Wilhelmina the kingdom of Holland and the duchy of Luxembourg would, therefore, again be united. Hence the match. Grave complications might happen by the death of Wilhelmina.

Justice Miller. The death of Justice Miller will recall to those who witnessed it one remarkable scene. It was the installation of Chief Justice Fuller at the beginning of the October term of the United States supreme court in 1888.

Justice Samuel F. Miller was the senior justice of the court. As such it was his duty to welcome the new chief justice and extend to him his hand. Miller stood beside Chief Justice Fuller as the judges took their respective places. Mr. Fuller was small, delicate and slight as a woman, making with his snow white hair and long, flowing white mustache a striking appearance. Justice Miller was over six feet in height and massive framed in proportion, like the big Kentuckian he was. He towered above Mr. Fuller like a giant, the proportions of each appearing more pronounced by the contrast.

Justice Miller was regarded by many lawyers in both political parties as the ablest expounder of constitutional law in his time. His mind was admirably fitted to his magnificent physique. For twenty-eight years he has endured the cramped quarters and bad moral and physical air of the United States court room at Washington without weakening. In 1886 he was old enough to retire under the law permitting chief justices to resign at the age of 70, with honors and their full salaries continued the rest of their lives. But Justice Miller showed not a trace of either physical or mental weakening at the age of 70, and so continued on at his duties, dying, as all workers wish to die, in harness.

Japanese Unitarians.

"Buddhism in its highest state and Unitarianism are just the same," says Mr. Kentaro Kaneko, a member of the Japanese privy council. Whether this is a compliment to Buddhism or Unitarianism we leave the reader to decide. But it shows how easily and gracefully the amiable Jap's religion sits upon him when it is mentioned that many of the most cultured of the Japanese, both in official and private life, actually propose to "Hop," so to speak, over from Buddhism to Unitarianism, just for the purpose of being in harmony with the western world, whose customs they are adopting. They do not do this from any profound convictions either of conscience or spirituality, but because it is the proper thing. Unitarianism is the form of Christianity that will make the transformation most easy; therefore, say the advanced thinkers of Japan, let us adopt Unitarianism as we adopt trousers and French millinery.

The Unitarians are to be congratulated on this accession of millions of converts to their ranks, but how will the rest of the Christian world, who have spent a thousand dollars for converting the heathen where the Unitarians have spent one, regard this kind of a change in religion?

Mr. Fukuzawa, an eminent Japanese author, advises his countrymen to make the leap from Buddhism to Unitarian Christianity in these words:

Let us take it, not because it is true, but because it is the creed of the most highly civilized nations, and Japan should wear the same dress as her neighbors with whom she desires to stand well.

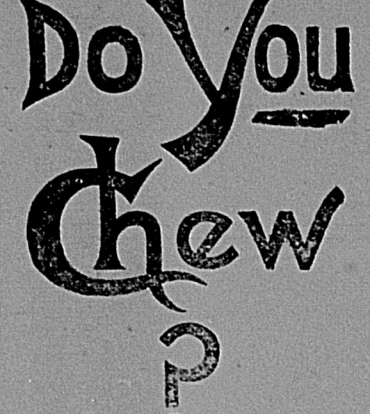
