

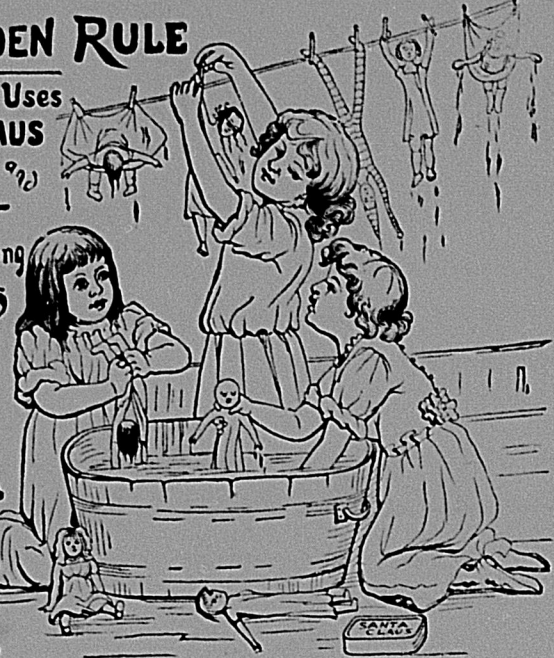

PEOUARI PRACTICE.

The Death of Mrs. Abigail Gregory Attended By Very Suspicious Circumstances.

The funeral of Mrs. Abigail Gregory, of Garden City, Kansas, occurred yesterday at Thornton, a number from this city attending the services. Mrs. Gregory was born in this county in 1836 and here passed the greater portion of her life, loved and honored by all who knew her. Her husband, the Rev. Samuel Gregory, represented this county in the legislature but in 1869 died leaving his widow almost penniless and with six small children to raise. Mrs. Gregory, however, was equal to the task and raised them all to be men and men of credit and influence.

Mrs. Gregory's death is surrounded by some peculiar and suspicious circumstances. A few days previous to her death she was slightly indisposed and called in Mrs. Dr. Cartwright a female practitioner of Garden City and a graduate of the Marion Medical Institute of Indiana. Mrs. Cartwright prescribed some white lozenges which were taken according to directions. Mrs. Gregory shortly after taking them was in the most terrible convulsions and other physicians being called at once pronounced it a case of poisoning by corrosive sublimate. Mrs. Cartwright denied having prescribed such a drug and declared that it was merely a case of acute gastritis. After Mrs. Gregory's death an autopsy was held and it was found that the stomach was entirely eaten out by corrosive sublimate of which deadly poison Mrs. Gregory had taken perhaps seven grains. Mrs. Cartwright maintains her independent attitude but the case will be taken in hand by the county prosecutor and will be settled to the bottom. Mrs. Cartwright has made but one concession and that was to the effect that the lozenges contained a little citric acid.

Preparing to Celebrate.

The committee on arrangements for the Columbian Day celebration met last evening at the mayor's office. The following orders were reported as having accepted the invitation to take part in the parade: G. A. R., K. of St. J., P. O. S. of A. and Red Men. The other orders will all doubtless accept but up until last night had not held meetings to take action. E. J. Baldwin to-day shipped by the American express company to the Santa Anita Ranch of Lucky Baldwin in California a part of a car load of Shropshire Down sheep imported by Willard Taylor of Ripley township, this county, from the famous Finley flocks of England. On the famous Lucky's ranch the raising of this breed of sheep will be tried and if proved successful will be entered into largely.

In the "glorious climate California" Mr. Baldwin believes that anything can thrive and succeed, so in making his shipment of sheep he made a shipment of another kind. He included three opossums, a pair of game chickens and thirteen fox squirrels. It is not to be doubted but that these animals, none of which now flourish there, will grow in the peculiar climate to be mammoth wild beasts and their descendants will furnish to the inhabitants of California exciting hunts equal to the tiger hunts of India. Think of game chickens as large as ostriches with spurs like sharpened crow bars, of fox squirrels as large and fierce as tigers with teeth as long as horse shoe nails, and of opossums with pouches large enough to allow them to pack off three or four men in them. 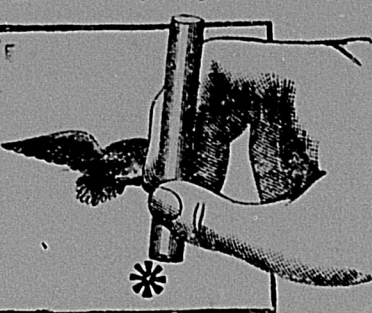
INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS.

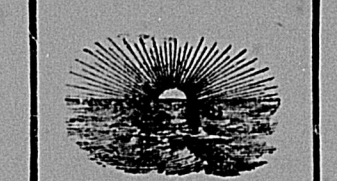

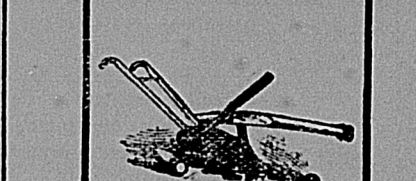

of the names of the polling clerks on the back thereof can be seen. Then hand your ballots to the inspector, the stamp to the polling clerk, and leave the room.

Fifth. If you are physically unable to stamp your ballots, or can not read English, so inform the polling clerks and tell them how you wish to vote and they will stamp your ballots for you. But the voter and clerks should not permit any other person to hear or see how the ballots are stamped.

Sixth. If you should accidentally or by mistake deface, mutilate or spoil your ballot, return it to the poll clerks and get a new ballot.
