

# For the Crawfordville Review. **MONTGOMERY TEACHERS ASSOCIATION.**

There will be an association of the teachers of Montgomery county and adjoining counties, held in Alamo on Friday and Saturday, the 7th and 8th of April, 1854. This Association is now thoroughly organized, having adopted for its good government and mutual harmony a constitution and by-laws similar to those of other organizations of the kind, and many energetic, competent and whole-souled teachers have attached themselves to it. Permanent officers were elected at the last meeting, held in Yountsville on the 18th of February last for a term of six months, as the constitution requires dating the first regular meeting from the 7th and 8th of April next. The officers chosen are as follows: Prof. Caleb Mills of Wabash College, President; Francis M. Black of Alamo, Vice President; James H. McCollough of Crawfordville, Treasurer; Joseph A. Gilkey of Crawfordville, Secretary; W. P. McKee, of Yountsville, Francis Hammel and John W. Copner, of Alamo, Managers.

The following members were selected to deliver addresses from time to time during next meeting: Prof. Caleb Mills will deliver the opening address on Friday at 11 o'clock A. M. F. M. Black on reading, some time during the afternoon session of the same day. Prof. Mills again at candle-lighting, on the subject of common school government. Forenoon session, Saturday the 8th, James H. McCollough on Mental Arithmetic, and Joseph A. Gilkey on Written Arithmetic. Prof. J. L. Campbell of Wabash College will deliver a popular address at 11 o'clock. Other eminent teachers and speakers from various sections of the county will be in attendance and deliver addresses when ever opportunity offers. The afternoon session and candle-lighting will be taken up with miscellaneous business, after which the Association will adjourn to meet in three months at some convenient point within the bounds of the association as the constitution defines. All practical teachers, ex-teachers and others are earnestly invited to attend and become members of the Institution. All are most cordially solicited to be in attendance at our public addresses. The ladies especially are most warmly invited to attend and cheer us as usual with their presence. The board of managers have secured the large and commodious Methodist church, in which to hold the Association.

The citizens of Alamo and surrounding country are requested to extend their usual hospitality on that occasion.
