

## AMERICAN FEELING TOWARD ENGLAND.

The Marseilles correspondent of the *London Post* says it is a painful thing to record that it is not possible to "come into contact with Americans, and more especially with naval men, without observing the ill-concealed feeling of hostility which they entertain and cherish against England and the English. It matters little of nothing what fine and complimentary things their diplomats, their Peabodys and public men may say in after-dinner speeches; the fact is patent to every observer who mingles with the citizens of the United States that their mind is evil affected toward us, and that they allow envy and jealousy to poison the spring of better feelings." That is just what the people of this country think of the English!

Lord they never heard of—Grant Thorburn—"Laurel Tool"—appear now and then in New York papers with a reminiscence or a bit of a story. Here is his last:

In 1774, Dr. Webster was a popular preacher of the Kirk of Scotland in Edinburgh. Business brought him to London, and one day when passing the House of Lords, his curiosity induced him to make an effort to step in and see them. None were admitted without an order, except noblemen's servants. Webster being ignorant of the rule, requested admittance. "What Lord do you belong to?" said the doorman. "To the Lord Jehovah," replied Webster. "The Lord Jehovah?" repeated the doorman. "I have kept here seven years, but I have never heard of such a Lord. Jack," said he to his fellow keeper on the front steps, "he's a chap who says he belongs to the Lord Jehovah; do you know such a Lord?" "Never heard of him," says Jack. "But," said Webster, (willing to keep up the illusion) "there is such a Lord." "Pass on," says Jack, "I suppose it's some poor Scotch Lord."

This occurred at a period when there was not one in twenty of all in the manufacturing rural districts in England, who could read the Bible or write his own name. Sabbath schools were introduced in 1783.

TRAGIC SCENE.—A correspondent of the *Richmond (Va.) Dispatch*, writing from Prince Edward County, September 20th, furnishes the following particulars of a tragic scene lately enacted at the Court-house of that county:

At Prince Edward Court-house to-day the examination of a negro, charged with rape on a married lady, was to take place, but was deferred in the absence of counsel. As he was about being removed from the Court-house, the woman's husband, who was present, rushed on him with a knife and cut his throat from ear to ear. Physicians present dressed the wound, and gave it as their opinion that the negro would not die, as the jugular vein was not severed. The husband was arrested and shortly after bailed, in the sum of \$1,000, to answer for the act.

A NOVEL LUXURY.—The latest novelty from Germany is a musical bed, which receives the weary body, and immediately "lays it into Elysium." It is an invention of a mechanic in Bohemia, and is so constructed that by means of hidden mechanism, a pressure upon the bed causes a soft and gentle air of Ambur to be played, which continues to lull the most wakeful to sleep. At the head is a clock, the hand of which being placed at the hour the sleeper wishes to rise, when the time arrives, the bed plays a march of Spontoni, with drums and cymbals, and, in short, with noise enough to rouse the seven sleepers.
