SEC. 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Crawfordsville, that any person who shall interfere with the city Marshal in the discharge of his official duties, or shall hinder or obstruct said Marshal, or shall refuse to obey his commands, will be called upon, said Marshal to have him in his discharge of his official duties, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.
