AN ORDINANCE,

To Provide for the Licensing of Public Hacks, Carriages, Express Wagons, or other Vehicles kept or used for the purpose of Transporting Passengers, Freight or other Articles, to and from Points within the City of Crawfordsville, for Pay and Hire, and the Amount to be charged by the Owners Thereof, for Transporting Passengers and their Baggage, and to prohibit Minors from Driving any such Vehicle, unless Specifiedly permitted, and providing Penalties for Violation of its Provisions.

Sec 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Crawfordsville, That the owner of every public hack, carriage, express wagon, or other vehicle kept for the purpose of transporting passengers, freight or other articles, to and from points within the City of Crawfordsville, for pay and hire, or for the privilege of keeping and using such vehicle for the purpose aforesaid, subject to the restrictions contained in this Ordinance, shall pay a license fee annually, to the Mayor, for the sum of one dollar, except when the owners of livery stables, except when hacks, carriages or other vehicles are hired out by such owners, with drivers accompanying the same.

Sec 2. That any person receiving an application for such license, accompanied with the receipt of the City Treasurer for any of the above enumerated sums, shall file the same in his office and issue license to said applicant.

Sec 3. No person under the age of twenty-one years shall drive or control any public hack, carriage, express wagon, or other vehicle, used for the transportation of passengers, baggage or freight, without having obtained such permission of the Mayor of the City of Crawfordsville, who shall fix thereon in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.

Sec 4. Every person engaged within the limits of the City of Crawfordsville in transporting passengers, baggage or freight, shall pay to the Mayor, for such services, the following compensation, and no more: For each passenger with his or her baggage, or for each package, or for each hundred pounds of baggage, or for each hundred pounds of freight, twenty-five cents; for each trunk, box or package, not exceeding one hundred pounds, twenty-five cents; for each trunk, box or package, exceeding one hundred pounds, twenty-five cents; for each trunk, box or package, over one hundred pounds in weight, thirty-five cents; and for other boxes, personal baggage, or freight, correspondingly.

Sec 5. Any person who shall be engaged in the ownership of, or in the managing, controlling or driving any public vehicle kept for transporting passengers, baggage or freight, shall pay to the Mayor, for pay and hire, or for hire or pay, without such vehicle being first licensed according to the provisions of this Ordinance, shall, on conviction before the Mayor, be fined therefor in any sum not less than fifteen dollars, and not more than twenty dollars.

Sec 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and legal publication.

AN ORDINANCE,

To Provide for the Licensing of Public Hacks, Carriages, Express Wagons, or other Vehicles kept or used for the purpose of Transporting Passengers, Freight or other Articles, to and from Points within the City of Crawfordsville, for Pay and Hire, and the Amount to be charged by the Owners Thereof, for Transporting Passengers and their Baggage, and to prohibit Minors from Driving any such Vehicle, unless Specifiedly permitted, and providing Penalties for Violation of its Provisions.

Sec 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Crawfordsville, That the owner of every public hack, carriage, express wagon, or other vehicle kept for the purpose of transporting passengers, freight or other articles, to and from points within the City of Crawfordsville, for pay and hire, or for the privilege of keeping and using such vehicle for the purpose aforesaid, subject to the restrictions contained in this Ordinance, shall pay a license fee annually, to the Mayor, for the sum of one dollar, except when the owners of livery stables, except when hacks, carriages or other vehicles are hired out by such owners, with drivers accompanying the same.

Sec 2. That any person receiving an application for such license, accompanied with the receipt of the City Treasurer for any of the above enumerated sums, shall file the same in his office and issue license to said applicant.

Sec 3. No person under the age of twenty-one years shall drive or control any public hack, carriage, express wagon or other vehicle used for the purpose of transporting passengers, baggage or freight, to and from points within the City of Crawfordsville, for pay and hire, or for the privilege of keeping and using such vehicle for the purpose aforesaid, subject to the restrictions contained in this Ordinance, shall pay a license fee annually, to the Mayor, for the sum of one dollar, except when the owners of livery stables, except when hacks, carriages or other vehicles are hired out by such owners, with drivers accompanying the same.

Sec 4. Every person engaged within the limits of the City of Crawfordsville in transporting passengers, baggage or freight, shall pay to the Mayor, for such services, the following compensation, and no more:
