AN ORDINANCE,

To Provide for the Licensing of Public Hack-
Carriages, Express Wagons, or other Vehicles
kept or used for the purpose of Transporting
Passengers, Freight or other Articles to and from
Points within the City of Crawfordsville, for Pay
and Hire, and the Amount to be charged by the
Owners Thereof for Transporting Passengers
and their Baggage, and to prohibit Minors from
Driving any such Vehicle, unless Specially Per-
mitted, and providing Penalties for Violation of
its Provisions.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Com-
mon Council of the City of Crawfordsville, That the
owner of every public hack, carriage, express
wagon, or other vehicle kept for the purpose of trans-
porting passengers, freight or other articles to and
from points within the City of Crawfordsville, for hire
or pay, before he shall be permitted to use the same
for such purpose, shall first pay into the hands of the
City Treasurer the following sums, to wit: Two
hundred dollars, for each hack, carriage, express wagon,
or other vehicle for passengers, baggage or freight, Ten Dollars
for each horse carriage, express wagon or other vehicle
for passengers, baggage or freight, Six Dollars; Drays,
Three Dollars; and for each other vehicle, then and there
proportional amount at the discretion of the Mayor,
as an annual license fee, for the privilege of keeping
and using such vehicle for the purpose aforesaid, sub-
ject to the restrictions contained in this Ordinance.
Provided, That this section shall not apply to the
owners of livery stables, except when hacks, carriages,
express wagons or other vehicles are hired out by such owners,
with drivers accompanying the same.

Sec. 2. The Mayor on receipt of application for
such license, accompanied with the receipt of the
City Treasurer for any of the above enumerated
sums, shall file in his office and issue a license to
said applicant.

Sec. 3. No person under the age of twenty-one
years shall drive or control any public hack, carriage,
express wagon or other vehicle used for the purpose
of transporting passengers, baggage or freight to and
from points within the City of Crawfordsville, and
less he shall have obtained permission to do so from
the Mayor of said City, which permission the Mayor
may at any time revoke, and any person under the
age of twenty-one years who shall drive or control
or attempt to drive or control any such public hack,
carriage, express wagon, or other vehicle, used for
the transportation of passengers, baggage or freight,
as aforesaid, without having obtained such permis-
sion to do so, of the Mayor of the City of Crawfords-
ville, shall be fined any sum not exceeding fifty
dollars.

Sec. 4. Every person engaged within the limits of
the City of Crawfordsville in transporting passen-
gers, baggage or freight, shall be liable to a fine of
each service, the following, to wit: For each hack,
carriage, express wagon, or other vehicle, used for
the transportation of passengers, baggage or freight,
if such baggage does not exceed one trunk, its weight
not exceeding one hundred pounds, whichever trans-
ported to or from any point within the city, the sum
of fifty cents; for each additional trunk for each pas-
senger, the sum of twenty-five cents; For each fifty
pounds or the fraction thereof over one hundred
pounds of every trunk or box or package of each pas-
senger, the additional sum of twenty-five cents; For
each trunk, box or package, not exceeding one hun-
dred pounds in weight and without passenger, the
sum of twenty-five cents; For each trunk, box or
package, over one hundred pounds in weight, thirty-
five cents; and for other boxes, personal baggage, or
freight, corresponding rates only may be charged.
For each hour any vehicle is employed transport-
ing passengers to and from any point within the city,
one dollar may be charged. Any person who shall
violate any of the provisions of this section for each
offense, upon conviction before the Mayor, shall be
fined in any sum not less than five dollars nor more
than fifty dollars, and shall pay for transporting pas-
sengers, baggage or freight to and from any point in
the City of Crawfordsville, for hire or pay, without such
vehicle being first licensed according to the provi-
sions of this Ordinance, shall, on conviction before the
Mayor, be fined therefor in any sum not less than five
dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

Sec. 5. Any person who shall be engaged in the
ownership of, or in the managing, controlling or driv-
ing any public vehicle kept for transporting passen-
gers, baggage or freight to and from any point in
the City of Crawfordsville, for hire or pay, without such
vehicle being first licensed according to the provi-
sions of this Ordinance, shall, on conviction before the
Mayor, be fined therefor in any sum not less than five
dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

Sec. 6. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in
force from and after its passage and legal publica-
tion.
