

Another Monster Gun.

Another "twenty inch gun," the sixth in number, was cast at the Fort Pitt foundry on Monday, under the direction of that celebrity in his way, Col. Joseph Kays, the veteran foreman of the establishment. Preparations for the casting were made last week, the mould having been placed in the pit on Wednesday. One hundred and forty thousand pounds (seven tons) of the best Juniata iron were placed in three furnaces, the largest quantity in one being 68,000 pounds, and the remainder about equally divided between the other two. The fires were lighted at 7 1/2 o'clock Monday morning, and three hours and a half (11 o'clock) afterward the furnaces were tapped and the molten metal began flowing from through conduits at opposite sides into the mould, which was filled in 27 minutes, during which time a stream of water passed in and out of the core barrel at the rate of 20 gallons per minute, the water increasing in temperature in 10 minutes from 60 to 110 degrees, and in 40 minutes to 120 degrees. The casting was accomplished successfully, and without the slightest accident. The weight of the gun in the rough, when taken from the mould, will be about 140,000 pounds, and when finished 95,000; its greatest diameter nine feet four inches, at the muzzle thirty-eight by seventy inches; in length one hundred and eighty-seven inches, bore one hundred and fifty-seven inches. The gun is intended for the navy service, and is considerably shorter than others of like caliber heretofore cast.

When finished, it will be tested at the proving ground, for which a ball weighing one thousand pounds will be used; also nine charges of mammoth powder, the first three of sixty pounds each, the next three of eighty pounds, and the last three of one hundred pounds each.

The Negro.

A DAMNING EXPLANATION.—The Philadelphia Age publishes the following extract from the minutes of the committee that investigated the Conover case:

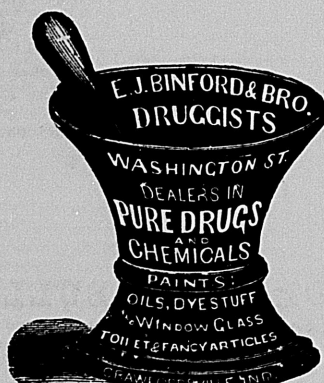
"Why," asked the Judiciary committee of William Campbell, "did you make this false affidavit?"
