The work goes deep into the mysteries of this strange religion, and lays bare its horrible licentiousness. It abounds in records of the vilest and most terrible occurrences, which make it read more like a romance than a veritable history.

Coming before us as it does at a time when the General Government is making a determined effort to restore order and morality in Utah, we find it a most welcome and useful work. It is far more thrilling than the majority of sensational books with which the country is flooded, and is calculated to do much good by giving the public a candid and impartial statement of a question which bids fair to cause no little trouble.
