ALL WERE SLAIN.

Fate of a Party of Eight Mexican Gold-Hunters.

THE TRAGEDY OCCURS IN WYOMING.

Searching for Lodes Known to the Ancients, They Find Americans in Possession—An Encounter Follows, in Which All the Foreigners Are Killed.

FOUGHT OVER THE GOLD.

CHEYENNE, Wyo., Feb. 11.—A party of eight Mexicans travelling overland reached this city six weeks ago and halted forty-eight hours to rest their stock and refill their larder. They were richly dressed, splendidly outfitted and bore every appearance of being aristocrats or Castilians, as they are called in Mexico. The wealth and reserve of the travellers excited curiosity and they were pried with questions as to their mission and destination. They were extremely reticent and gave evasive replies to their questions.

They had been gone for some time when it was whispered about that they were in search of old Spanish mines 125 miles north of here, which a local legend says are very rich in gold and were operated some 200 years ago with rude tools. Some gamblers and more especially one called "Mexican Monte" stoutly averred that the travellers were hunting for the Spanish mines, and that they were guided by a map or chart of great antiquity. "Mexican Monte" declared that the chart had been in possession of the family of Don Martinez for several centuries, and that it showed every vein in the mines operated by his countryman 100 years before the revolution.

The rich and mysterious Mexicans had almost been forgotten when George Keller arrived from the north Saturday to purchase supplies for a party of wild-horse hunters. He reported that two weeks ago he and his companions after following for several days an extraordinary fine bunch of native equines very difficult of capture, camped in the isolated locality designated as the old Spanish mine country. The horse-hunters could not resist the temptation to do some prospecting for the abandoned lodes. They found them, and near the entrance of what seemed the main shaft came upon the bodies of the eight Mexicans, who had met violent death. The hunters fled from the scene, but after a council decided to investigate. The adventurous Mexicans had found the Spanish Ophir, but American prospectors were in possession. The foreigners had claimed ownership and a battle to the death ensued. After a terrific hand-to-hand combat, in which knives and six-shooters were the principal weapons, the Mexicans were literally wiped out. There was every evidence that at least three whites had been killed. Some of the Mexicans had been frequently stabbed and gashed and blood was every where. Wolves had partially eaten the flesh from the bodies. Keller said the fight occurred in a canyon high up in the mountains and difficult of access. After the slaughter the Americans, who came here from Arizona late last summer, appropriated the stock, equipment and personal effects of the Mexicans and fled, presumably to Montana.

When the gambler, "Mexican Monte," heard of Keller's story he was beside himself. He said the Mexicans were scions of the foremost families of their country, and their parchment chart a Government document of great value, as it was a perfect map of the Spanish mines. He thinks that the American miners will return as soon as they recover from their fright, as with the aid of the map they can easily possess themselves of untold wealth.

STORMS ABROAD.

England, Scotland and Germany Visited by Pierce Gales and Heavy Snows—Several Vessels Lost in the English Channel.

LONDON, Feb. 11.—Snow continues to fall throughout the south of England and in Scotland and Wales. On the coasts heavy gales prevail, and a number of shipping disasters are reported. Telegraphic communication is greatly interrupted.

BERLIN, Feb. 11.—Reports of heavy snowstorms come from all parts of Germany. In this city the snow is a foot deep, and in the Bavarian highlands it has fallen to a depth of six feet. In the west and northwest thunder and lightning accompanied the snow. Traffic is almost entirely suspended in Schleswig and Jutland.

THE HAGUE, Feb. 11.—A storm of exceptional severity is raging throughout Holland. The rivers are greatly swollen, and Rotterdam, Dordrecht, Schiedam, Zwolle and Kampen are inundated. Many shipwrecks, with loss of life, are reported.
