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EXCHANGE SAYINGS.

The case of the State of Indiana vs. Oliver B. White, charged with the murder of Will Ellsworth, terminated in the circuit court Friday at 4:30 p. m., and was submitted to the jury. At 8:45 p. m. the jury filed into their places in the court room and the foreman presented the following verdict:

We, the jury, find the defendant guilty of murder in the second degree as charged in the indictment and assess his punishment at imprisonment in the State prison during his life. J. J. CHAPPELL, Foreman.

White received his sentence with indifference. He had sat through his trial with the same show of careless bravado and this is one of the reasons assigned for the extent of the sentence. The verdict caused general surprise and but few could be found who had imagined it would be such a long term.—Lafayette Journal.

The little girl, Nora was left in the house Thursday, while her mother went to the public well to get a bucket of water, and in some manner got several matches which it was playing with and when the mother returned the poor child was completely enveloped in flames. The mother raised an alarm and soon the neighbors came to help rescue the child from what seemed certain death. When the flames were extinguished an examination proved that its left limb and the stomach were badly burned. The sufferings of the child which pen nor picture can describe only lasted a short time, as its spirit passed to its maker about twenty hours after the burning took place. Interment took place in a Lafayette cemetery Friday. Mr. Snyder has many friends back here who extend their sympathy in this trying ordeal.

A thirteen-year-old girl of Jonathan Ingersoll while playing at school Monday accidentally swallowed a thorn, and it was at first thought it would result seriously. Dr. Hamilton was immediately summoned and in his usual successful manner removed the thorn and the child is now all right.

John A. son of Fred McClure, met with a rather severe accident on last Friday morning. He was playing with a shoe bottomer fascinated in its right eye lid, when he jerked it tore the flesh, which made an ugly wound. Dr. Hamilton was called in and pronounced it a painful but not serious wound.—Waynetown Hornet.
