There has been no court this week.
The regular November term begins next
Monday.

Frank Able, a Monon brakeman,
while coupling cars at Ladoga Saturday
had his hand cut off near the wrist.

Wheat is lower at present than at any
time in the past twenty years. This is
the way the McKinley bill protects the
farmer.

From want of rain during the past
month the sown wheat in many localities
is ruined and no crop is expected
from it.

The Dove Tail Buggy works were
sold at auction last Saturday. Judge
Snyder was the purchaser. Considera-
tion, \$5,000.

On account of elections being held in
several school houses of the county on
Tuesday next, schools will be suspended
until the day following.

The Waynetown and New Richmond

democratic rally at Waynetown to-day.

There have been few wagers on the
election next Tuesday, in fact fewer than
usual. All sports are doubtful this
year which way the cat is going to jump,
so they say.

Local buyers are paying from 40 to
60 cents per bushel for wheat. Four
years ago at this time, it was bringing
from \$1.08 to \$1.16—and still they claim
the McKinley bill protects the farmer.
How do you like it?

During the high winds of Saturday
some fencing on the farm of Harley
Wilkinson, south of the city, took fire
from some unknown cause and about
100 rods were destroyed before the
flames were gotten under control.

Since natural gas was first discovered
in Indiana \$20,000 have been expended
in Boone county in efforts to find the
cheap fuel without any success until
last week, when a gusher that sends
water and sand 75 feet high was struck
within the city limits.

The timber for the new trestle work
on the Big Four railway west of the
city has been hauled to the ground
and the work of putting it in will soon
be commenced. The trestle is about
100 feet long and the work will require
several weeks to complete it.

The last rally of the various political
parties will be held to-day in various
parts of the State and country. The people
very generally will be gratified in
the knowledge that the campaign is
over and that something else is hereafter
to absorb the public attention.

The question for us American citizens
to consider seriously and answer
with our next Tuesday is not
whether free trade is a good or
a bad thing for England but is
McKinleyism a good or a bad thing for
us. Our conditions are not English
conditions.

schools at Mace, were married on Saturday
evening last by Rev. G. W. Stofford
at his residence at the head of east
Market street. These are very worthy
young people and have the universal
well wishes of their many friends.

ton Echo last week, N. B. Coubert, the
republican candidate for representative,
has been around "seeing" brother Pitt-
man. Although a republican of the un-
compromising sort, Mr. Pittman up to
the present time, has conducted his
paper perfectly free from political bias,
and we are sorry to see him fall from
grace, at the last hour.

It is reported that Mat Griffin, well
known all over this community and an
old veteran of the 40th, is absent with-
out leave and whereabouts unknown.
He left here last week with two car
loads of ties for Frankfort, and was after-
ward seen in Colfax. He said there
he was going to the Soldiers' Home at
Marion. Mat is a great big good hearted
fellow, but leaves a family in poor cir-
cumstances. —Darlington Echo.
