HAWAII.

Indications do not point to a speedy admission of Hawaii, the principal of the Sandwich Islands, into the United States of America. This administration is not in one-half as big a hurry about it as was that of President Harrison's. Had Harrison remained in power three months more Hawaii with its half civilized creatures, sugar speculators, volcanoes and all would have been taken in regardless of the injuries, benefits or what not to this country, and all the official positions upon the island filled with hungry republican once hunters. The admission of Hawaii into the Union is a very questionable proceeding, and those in authority should think long and earnestly in the matter before determining what to do. Would it be good policy? Does this country now, or will it hereafter need additional territory? If so, would not Canada and Cuba, which adjoin us be much preferable to an island in the Pacific ocean 2,000 miles away? If we are seeking new territory should not these countries near us be first looked after? What great advantage to this country would the admission of Hawaii be? Correspondents from Washington City say that Cleveland and Gresham are favorable to the admission of Hawaii. We doubt this very much. We believe sound statesmanship will oppose the admission—because we do not need it and can get along easily without it.

DEDICATING THE MONUMENT.

A faction of the G. A. R., but which seemed to control the entire assemblage at their late encampment at Evansville, determined to take no part in the dedication of the soldier monument at Indianapolis in September next, as the Commissioners had determined, permitted the figures 1846-48 to remain on the monument along side of those 1861-65. It is a shame that such ridiculous sentiment should pervade the G. A. R.; that fanatics of the Cheadle stripe should be able to voice its sentiment. The G. A. R. has many sound, sensible men within its organization, but the Cheadle wing of it places it by this action in a very ridiculous and unwise attitude. The monument will be dedicated all the same and in future ages will stand as a fitting emblem of the valor and patriotism of all Indiana soldiers of all wars in which they were engaged, while this fanatical spirit created by a small quota of soldiers of the last war will be forgotten in a few short years.

CHICAGO AND THE FAIR.

Chicago will do well to aim to curb the hogfish propensities with which she has always been credited, in her treatment of visitors during the World's Fair. The impression among many is that visitors are to be skinned of their money at every hand; that alitudinous prices are to be demanded for everything. The first few weeks will demonstrate the truth or falsity of the assertion. The first visitors will immediately report to the outside world any attempts at extortion and their reports if unfavorable will injure to a considerable extent the financial prospects of the World's Fair, for people will shun any attempt at gouging if forewarned. Chicago's future prosperity to a great extent will depend very much upon her management of the Fair and the treatment of strangers within her gates.

REPUBLICAN PROPHECIES.

Republican newspapers and orators proved themselves false prophets and great liars. If the democrats won in the election they asserted all the manufacturing interests would be paralyzed, business would at once be stagnated and a panic of "hard times" at once be inaugurated. Since the election over a half hundred of new manufacturers have located in the gas belt of Indiana, and business of all kinds there as elsewhere has shown steady increase. Republican prophecies in this as in a thousand other instances indicated how little the party knew of the state of the country or the temper of the people.

COFFEE.

Several brokers in coffee were reported in New York last week as having failed and made assignments. If there is any class that should become "dead broke" it is the speculators in coffee. For years consumers of the beverage have been compelled to pay just twice what it is worth. Good coffee at retail cannot be purchased for less than 30 cents per pound, as much again as it should be. Of course poor coffee can be purchased cheaper, but good cannot. The coffee product is manipulated by trusts, and they force the people to pay two prices if they need the article.

Thus far the appointments by the administration of individuals to the various important positions to be filled for the next four years, have seemed to be well chosen, especially is this the case in most of the missions to European countries. The incumbents very generally are intelligent, well educated, and experienced in official affairs, and the country will have no cause to regret their appointment to these high and responsible positions.

THE UNION LEAGUE CLUB, a silk-stockings republican club of New York City, has said that it wants no Hebrews as members of that organization. This will be interesting news to Hebrews who have hitherto affiliated and voted with the republican party. The democratic party is the party of all the people.

REPUBLICAN newspapers are quite free in their comments over the appointment by the present administration of numerous "Confederate Brigadiers," as they are pleased to term several of those lately appointed from the South, to various foreign missions; in fact they have even more to say about it than when Longstreet, Mosby, and several "Confederate Generals" were given official positions by a republican administration some years ago.

H. H. WARNER, the noted patent medicine manufacturer, was reported as "busted" and insolvent by the daily papers last week. If his insolvent should prove a termination of his long winded essays on "Kidney Cure" that have been published for years past in most of the weekly papers of the United States then his loss will be the public's gain to some extent at least.

AMONG the mysteriously missing is the tin plate liar of the last campaign. The republicans say nothing about him since then. He was perhaps discharged for failing to fulfill his promises, and is wandering aimlessly about hoping for employment under the party in 1894.

ONE of ex-President Harrison's lectures before the law students of the Leeland Stanford University on "McKinleyism and how it dismantled the republican party," might prove of considerable interest to the future statesmen of the Pacific coast.

TWO mysterious murders occurred at Indianapolis last week. Arrest of suspected persons followed speedily, of course, yet with all the powers of the detective force of the city the murderers have not yet been made known.

THE WORLD'S FAIR opens at Chicago on Monday next continuing until November 1st. A large number of people from abroad are in Chicago to witness the opening ceremonies of the Fair.
