NEW STEALS.

By the operation of the laws of the last legislature several new steals, in the interest no doubt of some miserable paupers who find it difficult to make both ends meet unless filching money from the public treasury, will hereafter be in force. One is the truant law. An individual is appointed in each school district to look up scholars who may remain away from school without valid reason, and report the same to the school authorities. Of course he is paid for his trouble. He would not work without it, however little time he might be employed. It is nothing but a steal. There is no necessity for it. Matters run along at schools heretofore without the aid of any truant officer, and could continue. There are several hundred of these truant officers to be appointed through the State, and many hungry individuals have already made application to be appointed. The tax payers have to furnish the bread and meat to support these truant officials, and much money will be required.

Another big steal is that requiring township trustees to provide a sterilizing machine in every school house to make it healthy and prevent the children being attacked by the deadly microbe, which lurks in the air and water, and kills people by the score, as some highly "scientific" medical authorities allege. It is a first class steal and some body is going to make money off of it if the law is enforced. A nice, affable, pious and learned looking individual from Indianapolis was here last week and agreed to furnish the apparatus for every school house for \$22.50 each. Of course he and the firm he represents had nothing to do with the enactment of this law; it is pure benevolence and regard for the health of school children that brought him over here. Were we a trustee we would take the liberty, we believe, to defy this law, and carry the matter to the highest court before complying, or else manufacture our own sterilizing apparatus. Such attempts as these to reach into the pockets of the people is the bight of piracy, and should be prevented if there is any legal way of doing so.

LAITY REPRESENTATION.

A number of the most prominent members of the Methodist church at Indianapolis, Greensburg, Connersville and a dozen or more cities of the State have lately met or are to meet to resolve and ask that the laity portion of the organization shall have a greater representation in the management and business connected with it than heretofore. The ministers of the conference of the church are not even in the proportion of one in ten compared to the lay members, yet they have three times or more voice in the management of the church. The lay delegates seem determined to correct this to some extent, and consider that as they furnish most of the means and munitions to combat Satan it is their right to have more voice in church government than heretofore. It may be that the church would be more prosperous hereafter were the laity more thoroughly represented.

"HEAVY" ON THE CHARGE.

Sugar Creek township has an official in the person of its trustee who from reports holds down his office strictly for the money that is in it, and not in particular for the accommodation of his neighbors and friends. His name is Capt. Custer and in the matter of grand charges he appears to rival his namesake, the Indian fighter of the west, in many of his contests with red men. He received, we learn according to his itemized statement, the sum of \$425 for his services for one year, which is nearly or quite twice the sum asked by former trustees of the township for similar services, and who were fully as competent as he. One of the heaviest tax payers of the township in conversation with us a few days since said there was considerable indignation felt among many of the tax payers at the increased expense of the trustee's office in a township with the population of Sugar Creek, while at the same time the commissioners are strongly censured for not scanning his bills more closely and cutting off a number of items or charges. Custer has made for services. For driving a band of mowers or gypsies from off a school lot, which probably required fully 30 minutes of his precious time, he is reported to have demanded the pay for one day's service as trustee in protecting school property. Another occasion is cited where they run out of chalk at one of the school houses. A boy was sent to some point to procure it by the trustee, and for this the per diem was demanded and allowed. But after all the trustee is a good republican, the township is republican, the commissioners are all republicans; and what are you going to do about it?

Mr. Adams, American and United States express companies, which had at one time determined on resisting the payment of \$86,000 due the State, have gained their second wind, so to speak, and have concluded to pay the sum without further litigation. 


