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COL. BADEN POWELL commanding the British forces at Mafeking when summoned by Col. Croux to surrender and "avoid further bloodshed," refused, saying: "When will the bloodshed begin?" A brave answer and worthy of an English soldier, but he found the very next day when the bloodshed would begin, and he asked for an armistice in order to bury his dead. The Boers generously assisted to place the dead in the wagon, and demonstrated the fact that they not only knew how to fight, but also how to treat a foe with generosity, and meet him on the common ground of humanity. Evidently there is good blood being spilled on both sides, and it might better be employed than in watering African soil.

THE friends of Congressman Landis are now assuring the public that all opposition to that gentleman's renomination has died. For the first time when they believe that opposition is a corpse do they acknowledge its existence. It may possibly be found to be a very lively corpse before the time for nomination rolls around. The record of Mr. Landis on the civil service is not such as to appeal with great force to the very large branch of his party that believe in the system. Of the spoils system we have had enough and to spare.

THE talk about this country giving material assistance to England in case there should be interference by some other European nation in the South African difficulty is simply a bad case of "Tommy-rot." Whatever may arise in the future there is now no earthly reason in sight why America should not keep her finger out of the pie. It is a quarrel of very doubtful ethical propriety on the part of Great Britain, and it would ill become America to get too enthusiastic in her demonstration of friendship for the British.

JOHN SHERMAN continues to criticize the administration in a manner that must be rather galling to the Hanna coterie. Sherman believes that the party of Lincoln and Grant has fallen upon evil days under the guidance of weak, incompetent or unscrupulous hands, and does not hesitate to say so. Sherman is out of politics, and now speaks from the standpoint of an American citizen rather than a partisan. The fact gives new importance to his opinion.

ACCORDING to President Schurman, of the Philippine commission, polygamy is one of the cardinal principles of the religion of the Sulus, as they are Mohammedan and he thinks it would be very unwise to attempt to interfere with it in any way. So we are confronted with another condition that requires careful handling, and complications are becoming more complicated in the Orient.

GENERAL FUNSTON has made arrangements to sue Archbishop Ireland for statements made in an interview in Chicago to the effect that Funston had looted Catholic churches in the Philippines. Very naturally the General resents such a reflection upon him. It would be hard for the people of this country to believe that an American officer would be guilty of such outrageous conduct.

IT is a cheering piece of intelligence that two-thirds of the gas territory remains untouched. The statement will gain more credence when the gas from that territory once demonstrates the fact that it is combustible.

THE Indianapolis News says of ancient Imperialism: "We may go out into the great world without necessarily thereby meeting shipwreck and disaster. We may succeed and bring back the golden fleece." True indeed! But is well to remember that nations sometimes go out for golden fleece and come back fleeced. The Philippine golden fleece is certainly guarded by the dragon and he has not yet been fed upon the sleep-compelling compound that renders his conquest easy. It was strategem after all, that brought back the golden fleece.

THE mule is a sorry substitute for the war horse of Solomon—the fiery steed with the thunder-clad neck and the red nostril. He will be much in disrepute in the English army, henceforth, and it is safe to say that he will not be left attached to gun and "unhitched." It was a particularly treasonable and ungrateful trick on the part of the mule at Ladysmith when they ran away with the gun and left the poor Britons unarmed and at the mercy of the Boers. They were certainly furnishing "aid and comfort to the enemy."

IN General Guy V. Henry the country loses a gallant gentleman and soldier. He has served his country well, and bore in many scars the evidence of his courage and loyalty. His soldiers lovingly called him "Fighting Guy," a sobriquet which bears witness to the esteem and admiration in which he was held by his soldiers, and a testimonial to his soldierly qualities which many a man, whose trade is war, would be proud to win. He needs no higher eulogy than the name his soldiers gave him.

WHEN a man once arrives at the conviction that he is carrying out personal desire only from a high sense of duty and moral obligation, he is a dangerous man. Entangled in the web of his own sophistry he seldom fails to enmesh others. As with men so it is with nations. It is refreshing and wholesome for either individual or nation to sometimes stand level and look into the eyes of truth. It is quite helpful often in finding the right path of duty.

ONE of the expected-to-be-a-candidate-for-Governor republicans, Col. Dodge, says that it becomes more and more patent that none but boddlers need apply. The man with the barrel will win the nomination, and others will be turned down, not gently but with exceeding great firmness. Haggard is supposed to be willing to produce the necessary article if desired. At any rate he is pushing his claims night and day.

AN anxious search is now being made by republicans for a progressive, unambitious, well-known, retiring, popular, pliable, properly located, just-the-right-sort-of-a-man. They want him for a Vice-Presidential candidate. They want a martyr to cheerfully meet political death, and walk smilingly into the open grave of the vice-presidency, and they would like for him to pay his own funeral expenses.
