

# FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, May 16. The Secretary of War, upon application of Representative Ely, has ordered the release of Col. Baldwin, of Va., to be exchanged for Col. Corcoran.

Capt. Parish and Lieut. Dempsey, recently released prisoners of war from Richmond, have been represented to the President and Secretary of War the necessity and justice of this arrangement on account of Col. Corcoran's health, and aided by Mr. Ely have succeeded.

Kerrigan to-day received through one of the lately returned Union prisoners, from Richmond, a note which was hid in a piece of soap, urging him to use his political influence to effect the release of certain prisoners of New York regiments. He also received the daguerotypes of the Union prisoners as they appeared at Castle Pinckney.

## Major General Wool.

WASHINGTON, May 16. The Senate to-day confirmed the nomination of Brevet Major General Wool to be a Major General for gallant conduct on the 10th of May, in taking the city of Norfolk, and for other gallant services.

The mails for New Orleans will be made up at New York, to be forwarded by sea by every steamer which may leave for that port. Therefore the communication between these cities will be frequent. Postmasters are requested to forward all mail matter for New Orleans to the New York post-office.

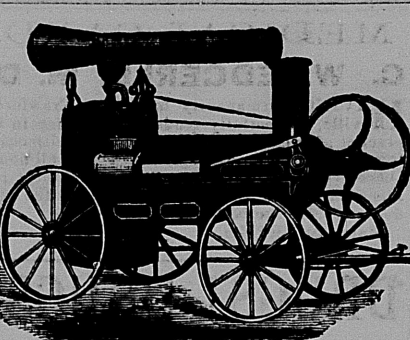
