## FIRST AID CLASSES IN SESSION IN ROCKPORT WITH CLASS OF 35

A class in the administration of first aid, under the sponsorship of the Spencer County Red Cross Chapter, was opened Monday at Rockport, with 35 persons enrolled. The instructions are being given by Mr. Costello from the National Red Cross.

Mr. Costello pointed out that among persons of all ages, only three diseases kill a greater number than do accidents. The diseases are heart disease, cancer, and cerebral hemorrhage. He said that, while it was impossible to evaluate a human life in dollars and cents, the wage losses, medical expenses, and insurance costs are estimated at approximately two and one-half billions of dollars annually.

"The costs," Mr. Costello said, "are distributed as follows: motor vehicle accidents, 33%; occupational and home accidents, 25%; and public (not auto-

mobile) accidents, 17%. Even in these days of large expenditures these wastes, occasioned every year by our accident tolls, stand out as major items in our national economy.

Stopping loss of blood, preventing infection, treating shock following accidents, prompt and correct action when limbs are broken, the use of tourniquets, bandages and splints, the proper method of cleaning wounds, caring of burns, and giving artificial respiration, are among the various subjects that are being taught in the progress of the class.

The record reveals that those who had first aid training meet with fewer accidents than the untrained.

Additional classes in first aid will be given by the chapter in various centers of the county in the future whenever they can be arranged. Persons who are taking the present course will be eligible to teach the standard course in First Aid.

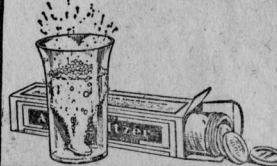
