Susan Anna Oenners was born Oct. 15, 1825, in Fairfield county, Ohio, departed this life Oct. 17, 1907, aged 82 years and 2 days. She was united in marriage to Henry Fast Nov. 21, 1850. To this union was born seven children, which is one son of Saint Marys, Joseph Fast, and one daughter of Decatur, Ind., Mrs. Emma Hook.
