We desire to extend our heartfelt thanks to our neighbors and friends for the many acts of kindness during the illness and death of our beloved mother.

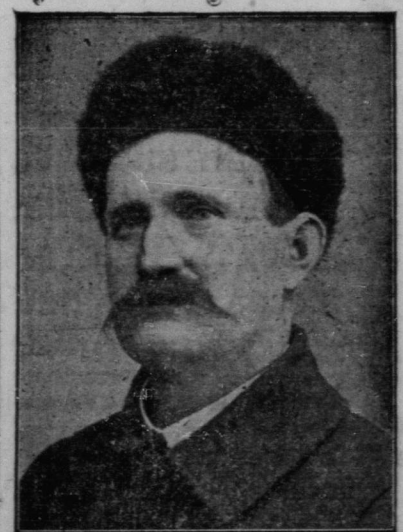
