of each member is to be \$5,000 a year. The president's appointments to the commission are to be subject to the approval of the senate and are to be made for life, no senator or representative in congress to be a member. Each member is to be an expert on the tariff question or some branch thereof, and it is recommended that a lawyer, a farmer and one man who is familiar with the tariff systems of foreign countries shall be among the members.

Representative Gilhams today introduced a joint resolution for a preliminary survey for a ship canal from Toledo to Chicago by way of Fort Wayne. Senator Hemenway will introduce a similar resolution in the senate.

The controller of the currency has approved the national bank of New York as a reserve agent for the Albion National Bank, of Albion, Ind.; also the Capital National Bank, of Indianapolis, as a reserve agent for the Farmers' National Bank, of Wadsworth, Ind.

According to statistics made public by the controller, there were 232 national banks in operation in Indiana on December 3, 1907, with a total paid-in capital stock amounting to \$24,106,040.
