Whereas, The Divine commander has removed our esteemed comrade who gave four years of his early manhood to the service of his country in the navy, also at the commencement of the civil war he enlisted as a private in Co. B 32nd regiment Wisconsin volunteers and was enlisted orderly sergeant and afterward commissioned lieutenant in which capacity he served until disabled by loss of hearing and injury of sight caused by smallpox, after having given fully three years of service in the civil war.
