## RESOLUTIONS IN MEMORIAM.

Decatur, Ind., Jan. 22, 1908.

To the Officers and Comrades of Sam

Henry Post No. 63, G. A. R.:

Yours committee appointed to draft

resolutions expressing our sorrow at  
the loss by death of our friend and  
comrade, Augustus C. Gregory, re-

spectively report the following:

Whereas, The Divine commander  
has removed our esteemed comrade

who gave four years of his early man-

hood to the service of his country in the

navy, also at the commencement

of the civil war he enlisted as a pri-

ivate in Co. B 32nd regiment Wiscon-

sin volunteers and was enlisted as

an ordinary sergeant and afterward com-

missioned lieutenant in which capacity

he served until disabled by loss of

hearing and injury of sight caused by

smallpox, after having given fully

three years of service in the civil war.

Resolved, That this community has

lost an honest, law abiding and pa-

triotic citizen. The family, a loving

and kind hearted husband and father,

and our post a patriotic, loyal and

faithful comrade who did not hesitate

in the hour of his country's need to

offer his services and his life if ne-

cessary to preserve this republic from

disolution.

Resolved, That we, as a post, extend

to the family and friends our sincere

sympathy in their sorrow and com-

mand them to Him who doeth all

things well. May we all have that

faith which can alone lighten these

great burdens.

Resolved, That our post hall shall

be draped in mourning for thirty days,

that this memorial be entered in the

records of our post, a copy be sent

to the bereaved family and to each

of the city papers with request for

publication.
