For table use they have developed one kind, for starch to be turned into alcohol another kind and a third for feeding stock. Seed for table use and for starch is brought to the highest perfection. The leavings make seed for the fodder crop.

The Wabash saloonkeepers who attempted to head off the commissioners' order for a local option election by injunction proceedings were three minutes too late with their restraining order. The saloonkeepers of Wabash and the saloonkeepers of other towns might as well accept the laws as they stand unless they can succeed in having them declared unconstitutional. Until they can accomplish something

in the constitutional line they would better be exerting themselves to obey the law and run orderly places, always bearing in mind that it was the violations of the law on the part of some of them that are responsible for the present agitation against their business.—Hartford City News.
