At the conclusion of the seventh grade exercises the soldiers and others repaired to the high school, where the freshmen gave a delightful entertainment in honor of the great hero. Every phase of the life of Lincoln was ably handled by the students and the Hon. D. E. Smith delivered an address which will long be remembered by all who heard it. He told of the early life of Lincoln, his record in public life and of his many qualifications which won fame for him as a champion of the causes of the people. It was a feast of oratory and the able attorney inspired his every auditor by the excellent thoughts presented. Particularly did the soldiers enjoy the program for the memory of Lincoln is as fresh in their minds as if the day of battle, which was prompted by the high ideals of the one whose centenary was being observed, was yesterday.

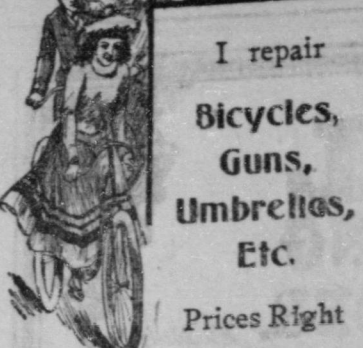

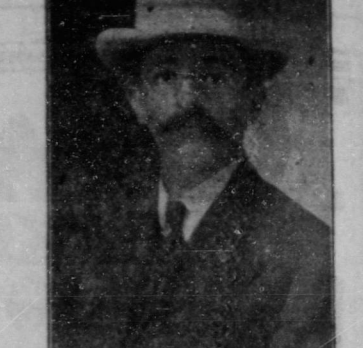
