good many callers, and some of the leading citizens of Auburn were among the visitors who assured him of their sympathy in his hour of great sorrow, as the rural cards of thanks have it. When Nicolai goes to Fort Wayne for preliminary appearance in the federal court tomorrow he will be in charge of F. E. Huffman, of Washington, D. C., a government secret service agent, and Sheriff Ralph Thomas and today it looked as though he would be attended by a guard of honor and a host of men of means who are not only willing but anxious to go on his bond. Mr. Huffman arrived in the city this afternoon. He expected to meet Bank Examiner Frazier of Warsaw, here, but there was some hitch in the arrangements and Mr. Frazier did not appear and could not be reached by long distance telephone. It is expected, however, that he will meet the detective in Fort Wayne tomorrow, when Nicolai is arraigned before United States Commissioner T. J. Logan. There is no doubt of Nicolai's ability to give bond. It is likely the bond will be fixed at \$5,000, but if it were twice or three times that sum it would be forthcoming, for as I have stated Frank Nicolai is the most popular man in Auburn. Dan M. Link, at whose house Nicolai had living apartments, is representing him, and he stated that Mr. Nicolai would appear on time tomorrow in the federal court in Fort Wayne and something like a dozen other Auburn gentlemen assured me that there would be no difficulty about the bond business.
