A DEATH MESSAGE

Joshua Mathewson of Lima, Ohio, Stricken With Paralysis

DIED VERY SUDDENLY

Was a Former Resident and Lived Here for Many Years

A message from Lima, Ohio, brought the unwelcome news of the death of Joshua Mathewson, a former resident of this city and well known here. H. W. Mathewson left for that place at once and will remain until after the funeral services. The news of his illness and death was meager, the only thing known is that he was stricken with paralysis and died suddenly, his relatives here not knowing of any illness until the death message came. He was born and raised in this county and for many years was a resident of this city. His mother is still living on the old home farm near Pleasant Mills, living with her daughter, Mrs. L. A. Springer. Another sister, Mrs. S. O. Bowser, lives near Monroe, and two brothers, H. W. and N. B. Mathewson, are residents of Pleasant Mills. The deceased was about fifty-five years old and for the past several years has lived at Lima Ohio, where he is well known and a highly respected citizen.
