## MAY GET THE JOB

Butler & Haugk Return from Trip to Jonesboro, Arkansas.

## BID ON STREET WORK

And May Get Job—Lowest Bidders on the Concrete Work—Many Bidders.

Albert Butler and Julius Haugk, who left Saturday evening for Jonesboro, Arkansas, where they bid on a job for the pavement of a street, returned this morning at 6 o'clock over the Clover Leaf. Messrs. Butler and Haugk state that they are not sure whether they will get the job or not. Their bid for the pavement if done in concrete was the lowest, and their bid for the pavement in brick was the second lowest. It now all depends upon the decision of the city, or those in charge, whether the street will be paved in brick or concrete. If in concrete, Haugk and Butler will get the job. The contract will be quite a good one, as the street to be paved is about a mile in length.

There were seventeen bidders in all. They stated that while there they met many of the former Decatur citizens, of which there is quite a colony. Among the latest arrivals there is Chris Voght, who went there two weeks ago, and is now a city engineer. They also met the Holthouse family, the Masons, Bert Lynch, Geo. Maddy, and Ben Pillars, and state that all are in good health, doing well and enjoying life. The weather is quite cold there at present, though not yet to the freezing point.
