M. E. CONFERENCE

It Will Meet at Bluffton
April 6th For Six Days'
Session.

A LARGE GATHERING

Three Hundred and Twenty-Five Ministers Will Attend Session.

Bluffton, Ind., March 3—The sixty-seventh annual Northern Indiana Methodist Episcopal conference will convene in this city on Wednesday, April 6th, for a six days' session, and yesterday the Rev. Wallace W. Martin, pastor of the Fort M. E. church, issued the complete program for the gathering. The Rev. Martin has the distinction of entertaining the conference on two consecutive years. Last year the gathering was held at Greenfield, from which city he was transferred a year ago to his charge here. The conference is one of the largest ecclesiastical gatherings of the state. Three hundred and twenty-five ministers from all parts of the northern half of Indiana will be present as well as several hundred lay delegates and visitors. The Wells County Ministerial association has and will accord the Rev. Martin its most effective aid in caring for the delegates. Not only the homes of the Methodists of the city will be thrown open to the incoming ministers but those of the members of other denominations as well. The first regular address of the conference will be delivered on Sunday, April 3rd, by H. A. Cobin of Depauw university. Monday and Tuesday will be taken up with preliminaries and on Wednesday Bishop Cranston will arrive to take charge, opening the conference proper.
