Mrs. Richer was formerly Miss Judith Stiner of Adams county. She was married to Richer in February, 1909. Richer is of Amish descent and owns 120 acres of valuable land two miles southwest of Grabill, in Cedar Creek township. He has a reputation as a hard-working man, but is said to be miserly in his disposition.
