it and which damage all alike. The malodorous muck-raker flourishes for a time, but he has come to be an object of contempt, since his recklessness and insincerity have become manifest. What has been said of the executive applies with like force to the indiscriminate, reckless assault upon the congress. Wholesale abuse, unfounded utterance, respecting the integrity and patriotism of those who frame and administer the people's laws, beget distrust, want of confidence and doubt as to the benefit of the government itself. Of course, if bad men gain entrance there, as from time to time they will, whip them out. But we should differentiate with great care the good from the evil."
