W. C. McGavoch of Chicago was here on business with A. J. Smith today.

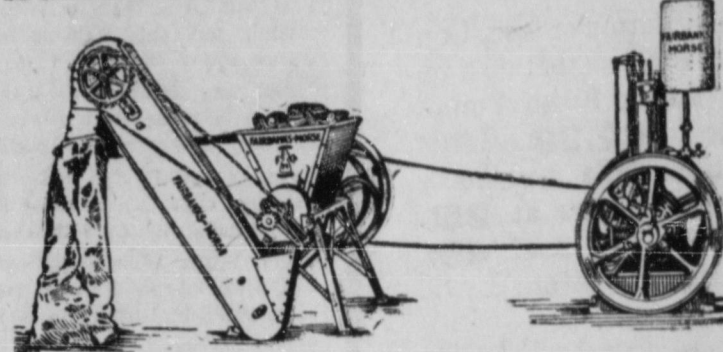
Homer Knoble of Bluffton was looking after business interests in the city this afternoon.
