The engineer and viewers' report on the Martin Reincking macadam road in Preble township was approved and the road ordered sold on the first day of the September term of commissioners' court, it being Monday, September 5th.

The treasurers for the school cities of Geneva, Berne and Decatur have made their annual settlements with the commissioners.

The board spent the forenoon today looking after a proposed bridge over the Wabash just south of Berne. Many of the citizens in that locality have been persistent in their demands that a bridge be built at this point, so the board visited the grounds to look it over.

Bids will be opened Thursday for the Monroe Elevator Macadam road, a short piece of highway in the town of Monroe, and which up to this time has run the regular routine of the macadam road extension law.
