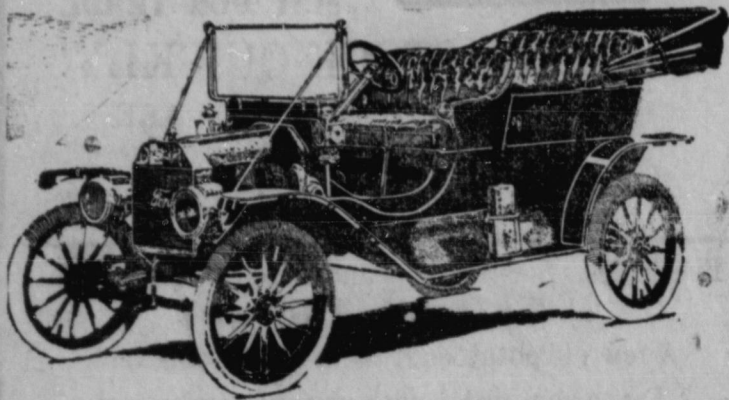

All vaults or privies must be cleaned out and put in a sanitary condition within ten days from this notice. There shall be no further notices served upon any one and after the ten days expire the secret sanitary officers appointed by me will file affidavits against all offenders of the law governing the health of the people.
