## CLEANER EATS.

There is an agitation all over the country among boards of health and consumer alike for cleaner food. Are we as consumers in Dayton, getting the best to be had?

I think we are not!  
Can't we help the conditions of our meats, milk, etc.?

Yes! If we demand it.

What to do:—  
First: To have our council pass ordinances regulating these things. An ordinance regulating meats would mean that all animals slaughtered for food purposes should be killed in accordance with rules laid down by the board of health; to be killed in a place built for that purpose and nothing else; when dressed to be put in cold storage and allowed to properly cool out before being delivered to the markets.

Under present conditions nearly all the animals are killed in the country, usually in the barnyard or out in the field, where flies, dust and dirt play as they please, or in some old shack called a slaughter house, which is far from being in a sanitary condition. After being slaughtered in this manner to avoid flies and other pests they are loaded into wagons warm, and covered with most any kind of an old cloth, usually old burlap or sacks. The meat being warm and not dried off, allows all dirt and dust to stick to it that comes in contact with it.

In a great many cities over the country the city maintains an abattoir and demands that animals killed for meat should be killed there under sanitary conditions, laid down by the board of health.

Our milk regulations could be bettered. We should have a Pasteurizing plant, which would lessen the danger from sickness from that source.

Can't we induce some one to start an artificial ice plant here. Cities much smaller than ours have long ago quit using pond ice. Artificial ice is much purer, and less liable to contain disease germs. Should we not as consumers demand the best we can get for our money. With a slogan as we have, "Decatur Can and Will," if so, let's try; there's room for improvement.

I would like to hear other's views on this subject.
