THE TUNIC OR SHORT OVERSKIRT QUITE OVERSHADOWS THE PLAIN OR DRAPED SKIRT

At the moment it is difficult to mention a gown without speaking of the tunic or overskirt, as in one form or another it is seen on most of the new models. Those wired at the hem swing away from the figure gracefully and are most effective when not carried to extremes. They are seen a great deal in transparent materials trimmed with fur or heavy embroideries. The sheerer the material the heavier the trimming seems to be the rule. Many of the overskirts are made excessively full, with the direct idea of adding to the size of waist and hip lines. They fall in their effect, however, when transparent materials are used, as the slender outlines of the underskirt are thrown more in evidence than ever.

When soft silks are used the tunic is often draped, the folds falling gracefully about the hips. In No. 7912 is shown a two-piece draped tunic that would be most attractive in charmeuse or in chiffon over a foundation of charmeuse. Chiffon would lend itself well to the folds of the underblouse. Nine yards of 36 inch silk are required to copy this model in size 36.

In 7919 another very graceful short overskirt is brought out with just a suggestion of fullness at the waist-line. This design is also suitable for soft silks or chiffon and could be edged effectively with a narrow strip of fur or a broad band of lace. No. 7919 may be copied in size 36 with 7 1/4 yards of 36 inch material. Each pattern is cents.
