

PETITION FOR MACADAM ROAD.

State of Indiana, County of Adams, ss:
Before the Board of Commissioners
Adams County, November Term,
1914.

We, the undersigned, each and all of whom are residents, adult freeholders and voters of Kirkland Township, in Adams County, Indiana, petition your Honorable Body that you construct and complete a free macadam stone road in said township, over and upon a public highway situated on the following route, to-wit:

Commencing at the northeast corner of the south half (1/2) of section one (1) in township twenty-seven (27) north, range thirteen (13) east, in Adams County, Indiana, running thence west over and upon the public highway, running through section five (5) on the half-section line in said township and range aforesaid and terminating at the northwest corner of the south half (1/2) of said section one (1) in said township and range aforesaid.

Said petitioners say that the improvement prayed for is less than three miles in length and connects at both ends with a free macadam road in said township.

Your petitioners further aver and say that the highway herein sought to be improved is the public highway already established and in use and is one of the public highways in said Kirkland township.

Your petitioners ask your honorable body that said highway above described be graded and that broken stone be placed upon said grade and upon such broken stone, there be placed stone screenings, and that this improvement be made exclusive of crushed stone screenings.

Your petitioners further ask that said highway above described be improved to the width of forty (40) feet, and that said highway above described be graded to the width of twenty-four (24) feet, and that broken stone be placed thereon to the width of ten (10) feet and to a depth of ten (10) inches in the center and six (6) inches at the sides thereof, and that crushed stone screenings be placed thereon to a depth of four (4) inches upon such broken stone, that said improvement be made a double track, and that the name of the same be "The Golden Macadam Road."

That to pay for such improvement we ask that bonds be issued by the County of Adams in the State of Indiana, payable in twenty (20) semi-annual installments or series, and for the payment of which we ask that a tax be levied upon the taxable property of said Kirkland Township, in a sufficient amount to pay the interest and principal of said bonds, as they become due.

That said improvement be made and constructed and that said bonds be issued and said tax be levied upon the taxable property of said Township, in accordance with the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana as passed in the year 1905 and as amended by the Acts of 1907 and the Acts of 1909, now in force, providing for the extension of free gravel or macadam roads and any and all other amendments thereto.

We further ask the board to take all the necessary steps as required by law to have said improvement constructed without submitting the question of building the same to an election of the voters of said Kirkland township, and that the board construct the same under the laws of the State of Indiana, providing for the extension of free gravel and macadam roads.

Before the Board of Commissioners
Adams County, November Term,
1914.

We, the undersigned, each and all of whom are residents, adult freeholders and voters of French Township, in Adams County, Indiana, petition your Honorable Body that you construct and com-

plete a free macadamized stone road in said township, over and upon a public highway situated on the following route, to-wit:

Commencing at the northwest corner of section twenty-three (23), township twenty-six (26) north, range thirteen (13) east, in Adams County, Indiana, thence running east on the section line road between sections fourteen (14) on the north and twenty-three (23) on the south to the northeast corner of said section twenty-three (23) and there to terminate. All of said route being in French Township, Adams County, Indiana.

Your petitioners aver and say that the improvement prayed for is less than three miles in length, connects at one end with a free macadam road in said township, and the other end with the township line, and that a United States Mail Route passes over said highway herein sought to be improved.

Your petitioners aver and say that the highway herein sought to be improved is a public highway already established and in use, and is one of the public highways of said Wabash Township, and that the same will be of public utility and benefit.
