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### HIGH SCHOOL LECTURE COURSE

The Senior Class of the Decatur High School has arranged for an excellent Lyceum Course for this year through the Extension Division of Indiana University. The course arranged for will be the largest ever given by Decatur High School. There will be seven appearances in the program for the year.

The first entertainment will be given on Wednesday night, October 27. The Imperial Quartet, which comes very highly recommended, will open the course. It will be of interest to know in this connection that this quartet recently entered into a two year contract with the Victor Talking Machine Company for a number of records. Some of these records will be on sale in November. The Chicago Herald speaks of them as being the best quartet on the road.

The second number of the course will be given on Thursday, November 18, by the Kuehn Concert Company. The company is made up of Mr. Kuehn, Mrs. Kuehn, Mr. Nicolai Zedler, famous violinist, and Miss Hazel Daggy, a soprano. Mr. Kuehn for years was one of the principal violins of the Theodore Thomas Orchestra of Chicago. He is a native of Germany and had attained high honors in his native country before coming to America. Mrs. Kuehn is spoken of in the highest terms as a pianist. Opie Read, the novelist, says of Miss Daggy: "There is no sweeter voice on the American platform."

The third number of the course will be given by Montaville Flowers, one of the most noted speakers on the American platform today. Those who heard his great speech on the Japanese problem on the occasion of our Chautauqua in the summer of 1914 need no further recommendation of Mr. Flower's ability as a speaker. He will not only entertain his audience in a most delightful way but he will give each and every one something to carry home worth thinking about. This third number will occur on Thursday night, December 9.

In order to avoid the cold of mid-winter the other numbers of the Lyceum Course will be offered in the Spring. Mrs. Nellie Peck Saunders, a dramatic monologist and interpreter of great plays, will appear in the fourth number. She is a woman of large experience in this line of the dramatic art and is sure to please her audience immensely.

The last number on the course will consist of a series of three nights. Mr. Charles Payne, a world famous traveler, will describe in a thrilling way some of his many travels abroad and will illustrate them with stereoscopic views. Mr. Payne has been on the Chautauqua platform for many years and is a splendid entertainer. His entertainments will be both highly interesting and at the same time very instructive.
