

Rushville, Ind., Feb. 13.—The organization of Indiana for the next Liberty Loan was begun here Monday at an enthusiastic district meeting at which dozens of Liberty Loan workers, both men and women, pledged that the counties in this loan district would absorb every dollar of the allotment that the United States government may put on them.

At a luncheon given at the Windsor Hotel, rousing speeches were given to the workers by the state staff of the Liberty Loan headquarters augmented by George S. Dunscombe of Chicago director of the Liberty Loan for Indiana.

County chairmen from Rush, Fayette, Union, Franklin, Decatur, Jennings, Ripley, Dearborn and Ohio counties told of the rapid progress which is being made in completing the war organization for the floating of the next Liberty Loan, and subsequent Liberty Loans, in their respective counties.

Such men as Walter W. Bonner, chairman of Decatur county; W. H. O'Brien, chairman of Dearborn county and formerly auditor of state whose records in the last Liberty Loan have been in the front rank of the records from all counties, told the workers that the next Liberty Loan will "go over the top" without doubt.

Mrs. Alice Foster McCullough, chairman of the women's Liberty Loan committee in Indiana, Mrs. Jessie F. Green of Anderson, state organizer for the women, and others planned splendid organizations of women for each of the counties in their districts, and each of the women county chairmen pledged that their counties would do their bit to such an extent that they would lead the way for other counties in the state.

Editors of newspapers throughout the district were called to the meeting and publicity plans were discussed in detail with these men.

The Indianapolis state headquarters delegation which met with the workers from the various counties, included Will H. Wade, vice director of the Liberty Loan in Indiana, Chester A. Jewett, assistant to Mr. Wade, R. E. Wilsey, an organizer and Walter S. Greenough, vice chairman of publicity.

From Rushville the Indianapolis party, the leaders in the women's work and Mr. Dunscombe went to Muncie for a similar meeting in the seventh district Tuesday.

Mr. Wade commenting on the Rushville meeting today said:

"If the other districts in Indiana grasp the organizational possibilities for the next Liberty Loan as have the counties in the eighth district, the United States again will take off its hat to Indiana as being in the forefront in war activity when the total subscriptions to the next Liberty Loan are reported to the treasurer at Washington."
