SOME FAVOR CONVENTION

Indianapolis, Feb. 7—Advocates of the proposed plan to hold a constitutional convention, or to at least be given an opportunity to present their case before the voters of the state were confident today that a bill pending in the legislature will pass. At the 1917 session of the general assembly legislation providing for the holding of a constitutional conven-

tion was passed but was set aside by the Indiana supreme court in a decision declaring the law unconstitutional on the grounds that such matters must be voted upon by the people of the state before they can be made effective. The present bill pending before the legislature provides for submitting the question of whether a constitutional convention shall be called be submitted to the voters of Indiana at the next election. Opponents of the measure, how-

ever, are claiming that if the previous measure regarding the calling of a constitutional convention was held to be unconstitutional that the present attempt will also be invalid under the rulings of the higher courts when put to a test.

THROUGH WITH IT

Indianapolis, Feb. 7—Senators and representatives, who have consistently supported state-wide and national prohibition today expressed their ser-

ious doubt as to the probability of any additional anti-liquor legislation being enacted by the present legislature. Fearing that a reactionary movement which will tend to overcome the "good effects" of Indiana's state-wide dry law is feared by many advocates and supporters of the prohibition movement, they state. While several bills have been presented in both the house and senate, which have as their purpose making Indiana bone-dry there is but little interest being mani-

fest in them by the major portion of the legislators, other than the anti-prohibitionists and the members "fathering" such measures.

Gifts and Souvenirs Given President and Mrs. Wilson Are Being Boxed

FOR RETURN HOME

Workers Are Busy at Murat Palace—Will Sail on February Twelfth.

Paris, Feb. 7—(Special to Daily Democrat)—They were packing up at the Murat palace today.

While President Wilson is not scheduled to sail before next Wednesday, his and Mrs. Wilson's gifts and souvenirs were being boxed, prepared for shipment. The pounding of hammers echoed merrily through the ancient house as rare paintings, books, statues, jewelry and cigaret cases were stowed in wooden cases. They weigh hundreds of pounds apiece and are worth hundreds of pounds sterling.

It has not been definitely determined whether the president will return to France yet the Wilsons are "cleaning house" as though they had no intention of coming back, despite the fact they would almost certainly occupy the Murat palace again on a return trip.

The president, despite the long hours he devotes to peace work, finds time to read interesting letters from all parts of the world, many of which he answers personally. One arrived today from Harold H. Rucker, 7 years old of Wichita, Kas., who said "I am studying as hard as I can in school, so I will be able to do something important when I am a man." The reply: "I am glad you are beginning early to have an ambition and I hope you will grow up to think of the country you love before you think of yourself."

MAY BE POSSIBLE

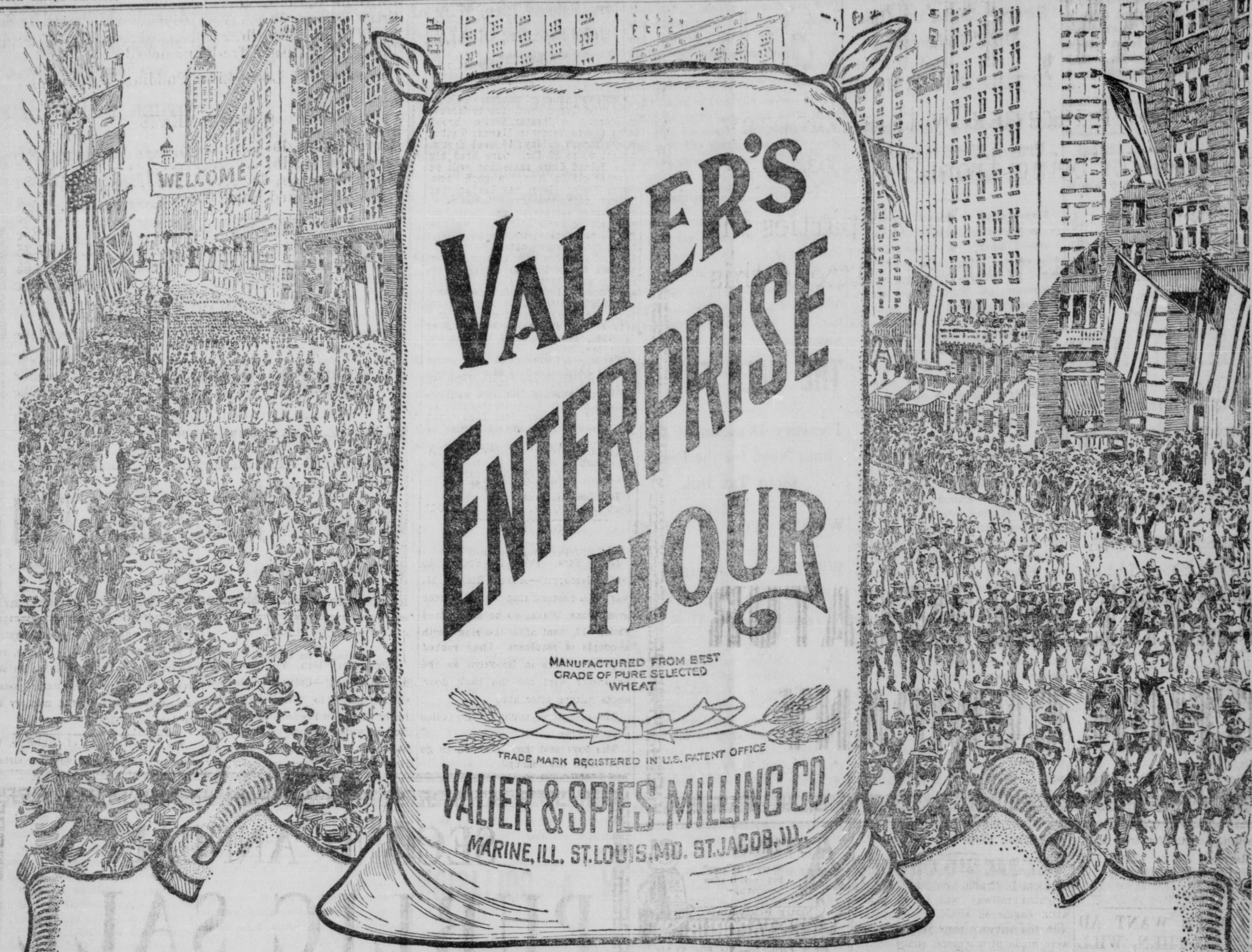
