

AFTER-THE-WAR ACTIVITIES OF THE AMERICAN RED CROSS

Two hundred of the 800 men in the Lake Division who are talking Vocational Training have been given loans by the Red Cross, usually when government checks have been delayed.

Recently the American Red Cross took care of 40,000 refugees who were living in box cars near Omsk, Siberia.

Military Relief service of the American Red Cross is being now rendered at 127 points throughout the country.

Up to October 1919 Red Cross Canteens in Ohio, Indiana and Kentucky had nearly 102,000 sandwiches a record which is second for all the thirteen divisions in the United States.

Seven doctors and seven nurses of the American Red Cross Relief Commission in Siberia are waging a strenuous fight against cholera in Harbin, Manchuria.

Dr. Alice Masaryk, daughter of the president of Czechoslovakia has resigned her seat in the National Assembly, a position corresponding to that of our congressmen, to devote her entire time to Red Cross relief work.

Throughout the Lake Division, Red Cross chapters will hold their annual meetings for election of officers wither on October 22 or October 23.

Health Centers are one of the proposed peace time plans of the American Red Cross.

The Red Cross has been asked by the governor of Texas to appraise the property loss in all districts affected by the recent disaster at Corpus Christi.

Princess Ilana, ten-year old daughter of the king and queen of Roumania is a member of the American Red Cross and helps the commission to her country distribute food to the children.

Two thousand sixty-four persons have taken the training courses prescribed by the American Red Cross Bureau of Training for Home Service.
