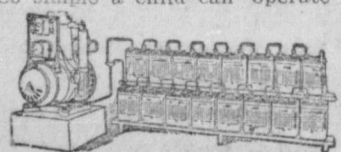

HOPE IS BLASTED

Judge Sessions Refuses to Grant Demurrer of Senator Truman Newberry

MUST STAND TRIAL

Case will Begin January 27th—Asked that it be Dismissed on 3 Counts

Grand Rapids, Mich., Jan. 12—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Hope of Senator Truman Newberry and 134 others indicted with him that the case against them would be dismissed faded today when U. S. District Judge Sessions denied a demurrer argued by the defense. Newberry's attorneys argued that the indictments were unconstitutional. The Newberry case will begin January 27 as previously arranged.

The three counts upon which the defense asks that the case be dismissed were that congress had whole power in state election matters.

That if congress does have this power it never has been exercised. That the penal code does not provide for election cases.

In his opinion Judge Sessions said in part:

"To deny the government the right to protect itself from such evils is to deny its right to exist."
