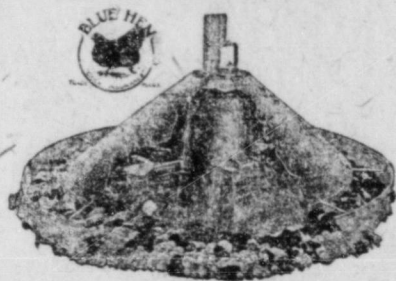

GOVERNMENT SELLS 9,100 FUR SEAL SKINS

Washington, March 24.—Secretary of Commerce Alexander announced today that 9,100 dressed, dyed, and machined fur seal skins from the take of 1918 on the Pribilof Islands, Alaska, were sold at the public auction held in the International Fur Exchange, St. Louis, Missouri, on February 2. These skins commanded the highest prices ever paid, one lot bringing \$177.00 apiece. Numerous other lots sold for over \$170 each, the average being \$140.97 each, an advance of \$49.63, or about 55 per cent. over the previous sale held last September. More than 600 buyers, representing 10 countries, attended the recent sale, which netted the United States \$1,096,833.23.
