INCREASE ON COAL

New York, April 1—(Special to Daily Democrat)—An increase of from \$1 to \$1.25 a ton in the price of coal was predicted today by bituminous mine operators to meet the increased wages granted miners.

The new contract giving miners an increase of 27 per cent. in wages went into effect today. It was agreed to by both miners, union representatives and mine operators last night.

The agreement will cover two years. The total wage increase will amount to \$200,000,000 a year, operators estimated.
