The people of Decatur, regardless of politics do not want the library closed and the board has decided to beg the state tax commissioners to approve the borrowing of enough money to tide us over until the next levy is made, and by that time it is sincerely hoped that the present autocratic powers of the tax board will be taken away from them. of Indiana may expect a blow-up in the republican party before the primary election. There is a regular squabble on among the candidates for the gubernatorial nomination and the different factions are stooping to the lowest levels and making every sort of an accusation against one or the other candidates. The Fort Wayne News as biased as it is along political lines demands a show down and an explanation from the republican candidates. The other day the fellow citizens of Warren McCray of Kentland, one of the republican candidates for governor caused to be inserted in many of the papers throughout the state an advertisement charging that a state-wide move was on to undermine and injure the candidacy of their fellow townman for the nomination. The advertisement has caused considerable flurry among those republicans favoring either one of the other candidates. Ed Toner of Anderson who is also in the race has attacked both McCray and Fesler for the way they are spending money to get the nomination and warned them that if they did not stop, they were liable to win up the same way as Senator Newberry did. It's so rotten that even the republicans cannot keep mum. Added to this is the dissatisfaction among the rock-ribbed republican and the progressives in fight to secure the Indiana presidential vote. The lines are breaking and it looks like a big blow up is coming. No doubt many republicans fear the outcome of the state and national conventions this year.

Phil Zoercher, who was appointed by Governor Goodrich as the democratic member of the state tax board, but, who seemingly has changed his politics since he has been drawing his fat salary as one of the "barons" and in the attempt to hold on to his job, is still trying to tell the people of Indiana that the present tax law is a money saver for the taxpayers. He wants the taxpayers in Adams county to overlook the item of \$19,757.35 which is paid to the state for the highway commission, besides the losing of the automobile tax which amounted to \$17,663.88 last year and says the actual increase to the taxpayers in this county is only \$5,978. Of course it would be nothing if you did not add the totals of the different state funds. Add the \$19,757.35 to the \$5,978.90 and you get a total of \$25,736.25, which is the increase that the Adams county taxpayers must send to the state, besides losing the seventeen thousand dollars of the automobile tax. There is an increase in everyone of the five state funds and Mr. Zoercher cannot dispute this fact. The taxpayers know this, the tax receipts show the increase and it will do him no good to have his letters printed in every republican paper in the state.

IT COSTS A FORTUNE TO WED IN AUSTRIA

Washington, April 16.—The high cost of marriage is causing general discontent in Austria, according to a Vienna newspaper forwarded to the commerce department.

The cost of marriage now is 240,000 crowns for the bride alone, according to the newspaper schedule. This is equivalent to about \$6,000 counting the crown as worth 2½ cents.

This amount would buy 32,000 crowns worth of dresses, linen 44,000 crowns and furniture 164,000 crowns. In Austria it is customary for the bride to furnish the house as well as providing her trossseau.

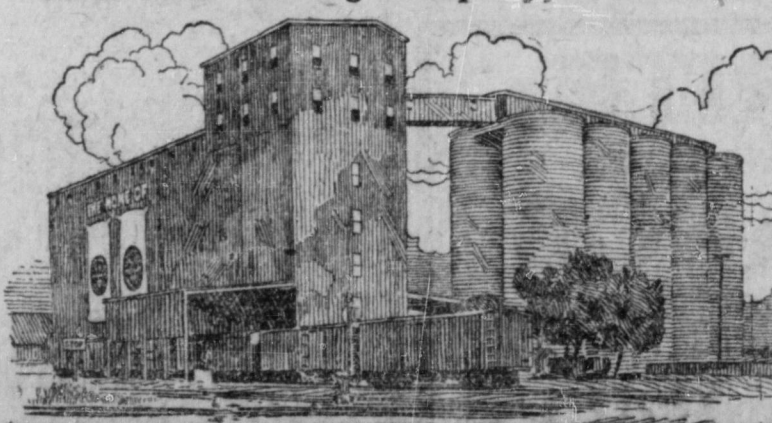
