## HOOSIER HOME HINTS

System in doing the work is just as important as good equipment and the housekeeper whose work "is never done" is often one who never stops to plan out her work to save time nor tries to prevent unnecessary steps by thinking ahead.

Rural school teachers who have planned to supplement the cold lunch carried from home, with some hot soup or cocoa prepared at school, testify that pupils are healthier and make better progress in their school work.

Many valuable hints on preparing the school lunch are contained in bulletin No. 72, which may be obtained for the asking from the extension department of Purdue University.

The canning season will be here shortly. Many suggestions on the cold pack method of canning are contained in extension bulletin No. 82, which may be obtained free.

From a half hour to an hour and a half will be saved daily by a dish drainer, a wire rack which holds the dishes after they are washed. Boiling water dashed over the dishes just after they have been cleaned takes away the necessity of drying them with a towel.

Some flowers in the garden will add materially to its beauty. A row of poppies or others which bloom along about the time the vines start to die, brightens up the brown spots considerably.

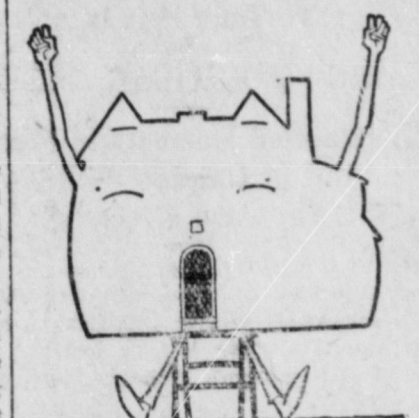
