MARYLAND FOR WOOD

Baltimore, Md., May 4—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Major General Wood carried the Maryland presidential preference primary by nearly a 2 to 1 vote over Senator Hiram Johnson. Complete returns from the entire state show Wood 15,900 and Johnson 8,059.

Wood carried Baltimore, all but two of the twenty-three counties, and will have complete control of the state convention which will select sixteen delegates to the republican national convention. The delegates will be instructed to vote for Wood for nominee for president as long as they believe he has a chance of obtaining the nomination.
